DPW introduces "*Microsurfacing*", *an* innovative, costsaving alternative for road maintenance. Microsurfacing is a preventative maintenance process best suited to address minor roadway defects and to address loss of roadway friction. It does not address subsurface structural deficiencies. It is placed in thin layers on streets that have not deteriorated to the point of needing an asphalt mill and overlay. Streets with a medium priority rating are prime candidates for this process.

The cost of a microsurfacing project is usually $\frac{1}{2}$ the cost of milling and resurfacing and extends the life of the pavement structure an average of 4 to 6 additional years.



We plan to microsurface approximately 35 streets totaling 15 miles of roadway in the city.

SUMMER GRASS CUTTING & RIGHT-OF-WAY MAINENANCE

Summer is here. It's time to cut the grass and trim those hedges.

DPW is working hard to keep Atlanta clean and beautiful this summer. Did you know that our Office of Solid Waste Services cuts grass and maintains areas within the public right-of-way? Here's what you should know:

The Office of Solid Waste Services has begun grass cutting & right-of-way maintenance in the public right-of-way at least twice per month in each quadrant of the city. We also provide removal of bulk items and residential street sweeping.

Bulk Collection is offered for pick-up of materials whose total weight and volume are too large for the City's residential garbage collection trucks to remove. This includes items such as: appliances, large furniture, large piles of tree branches, large metal, or wooden playground equipment, or similar items.

Bulk Collection is offered once per month, in each quadrant of the city. We will work in each quadrant during the week of scheduled pick-up until all streets are completed. Look for schedule notices on red and white signs posted at neighborhood entrances prior to pick up.

Residential Street Sweeping is provided monthly in each quadrant of the city. Sweepers travel along main thoroughfares that contain curbing in residential areas and also within the central business district. These crews primarily work at night and early mornings when there is less traffic on the roads. Look for similar signs posted at neighborhood entrances prior to scheduled service. Please do not park on the street during scheduled street sweeping service days.

CAPITAL PROJECTS AT A GLANCE

The Capital Projects Division of the DPW Office of Transportation has purview over major projects that include federal, state, and MARTA funding. This office works with the Federal Highway Administration, Georgia Department of Transportation, Atlanta Regional Commission, Community Improvement Districts and other governmental and quasi-governmental enti-



bring capital improvements to the city.

Funding for new sidewalks, streetscapes, traffic calming and other public improvements are managed here.

Several new projects are underway around the City. This month we are highlighting the Greenbriar Livable Center Initiative (LCI) project. This pedestrian oriented project runs along Greenbriar Parkway from Langford Parkway to the I-285 overpass. The improvements include intersection improvements, sidewalks, pedestrian lighting, street furniture, landscaping and street trees. The project will also include gateway features at the intersections of Greenbriar Parkway and Continental

Colony Parkway, and at Greenbriar Parkway and Headland Drive.

A ten-foot pedestrian walkway with brick pavers and a five-foot furniture zone are included in the project.

Street trees, pedestrian lights, landscaping. benches and trash receptacles will align the new sidewalk areas. A decora-

tive gateway wall with columns and a sign will be installed at Greenbriar Parkway & Headland Drive. Traffic signal upgrades at Greenbriar Parkway and Headland Drive will ensure a smooth flow of traffic particularly during peak travel hours.

This project is being done at the same time with similar improvements along Headland Drive, SW. Once completed both projects will provide for improved pedestrian access to transit and the surrounding Greenbriar shopping district.
