



Cheshire Bridge Road Streetscape Improvement Project

October 18, 2006

The City of Atlanta Department of Public Works is pleased to announce the completion of Phase 1 of streetscape improvements along Cheshire Bridge Road, Council District 6.



Cheshire Bridge Road Streetscape Improvements

Description

This project is located within the limits of the City of Atlanta on Cheshire Bridge Road from Piedmont Road to Manchester Street. The project included the relocation of 11 Georgia power poles, five of which have cobra street lighting standards attached. It also provided new concrete curbing, 8 foot sidewalks, 22 decorative streetlights, 52 appropriately sized street trees, and a multitude of various shrubs and ground cover on each side of Cheshire Bridge Road.

Funding

The funding sources used were approximately \$300,000 Federal Funds (Transportation Enhancement), and approximately \$100,000 Local Funds (Quality of Life Bond Program).

Status

The construction of this project is complete. There are a few minor remaining items to be completed within the next couple of weeks such as the removal of the old utility poles, the replacement of a pedestrian light fixture, and the relocation of a few street signs.

Additional Project Information

The master plan project limits for Cheshire Bridge Road are from Piedmont Road to Lindbergh Road (1.1 miles in length). Phase 1 is a prototype of other proposed projects along Cheshire Bridge Road which are anticipated to create a more walkable community. The other sections will mirror Phase 1, and are being submitted for funding and design approvals in the future.
