

The City of Atlanta is taking charge to design a “Greener Atlanta” with its 8<sup>th</sup> Developer’s Day that will focus on environmental sustainability and green development.

Developer’s Day is slated for Friday, May 25, 2007 at the Emory Conference Center beginning at 7:30 a.m. There will be two rounds of the Panel Discussion, where engaging topics will be Best-in-Class Green Development in Atlanta and Becoming Best-In-Class Green Infrastructure in Atlanta. The panel will be led by some of the best minds in “green development” who will offer valuable advice, information on incentive opportunities and will be on hand to answer questions.

An exhibit and concurrent breakout sessions on “Green Strategies and Resources in Atlanta” will be from 11:30 a.m. - 12:15 p.m. Subject matters will include Water Conservation, Construction and Demolition Opportunities, Energy Efficiency, an Overview of Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) and U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) Resources and the City of Atlanta Support and Incentive Opportunities with the Atlanta Development Authority (ADA). Lunch and a keynote presentation will begin at 12:30 p.m.

Developer's Day is hosted by the City of Atlanta and the Emory University Sustainability Office, with support from Southface, the U.S. Green Building Council, the Pollution Prevention Assistance Division (P2aD) of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, Keep Atlanta Beautiful and the American Institute of Architects.
