


# CITY OF ATLANTA - NPU M: 2010 POPULATION

According to the 2010 U.S. Census, the population of Neighborhood Planning Unit (NPU) M is 26,886, an increase of 5,527 (26%) from a 2000 population of 21,359.


The Map shows the population density (persons per acre) of each Census Block in NPU M. NPU M has an overall density of 11.1 persons per acre.



**AGE** 




The median age of the population is 30. Nine percent of the population is under 18, 5% of the population is over 65 and 49% of the population is between 20 and 39 years old.




In 2000, NPU M had a median age of 33.3. Ten percent of the population was over 65 and 44% of the population was between 20 and 39 years old.





**HOUSEHOLDS** 




There are 26,886 NPU M residents in 11,979 households. Of these, 23% are family households and 77% are nonfamily households. Of all households, 11% have children under age 18 and 9% have an individual 65 years and older.

Sixty-three percent of households are single person households, with 7% being single person households over 65, 10% are female headed households and 9% are husband and wife households.

The average household size is 1.56 persons per household and the average family size is 2.6 persons per family.

In 2000, of the 9,852 households in NPU M, 18% of households had children under age 18 and 58% were single person households. The average household size was 1.77 persons per household.


# 2010 Census Household and Group Quarter Population - NPU M




Sixty-nine percent of the NPU M population lives in households, and 31% (8,215) lives in group quarters.
