


CITY OF ATLANTA - NPU B: 2010 POPULATION

According to the 2010 U.S. Census, the population of Neighborhood Planning Unit (NPU) B is 47,292, an increase of 8,674 (22.4%) from a 2000 population of 38,645.


The Map shows the population density (persons per acre) of each Census Block in NPU B. NPU B has an overall density of 7.3 persons per acre.



AGE




The median age of the population is 35. Fourteen percent of the population is under 18, 13% of the population is over 65 and 44% of the population is between 20 and 39 years old.




In 2000, NPU B had a median age of 35.3. Sixteen percent of the population was over 65 and 46% of the population was between 20 and 39 years old.





HOUSEHOLDS




There are 47,018 NPU B residents in 26,229 households. Of these, 34% are family households and 66% are non-family households. Of all households, 14% have children under age 18 and 19% have an individual 65 years and older.

Fifty-three percent of households are single person households, with 13% being single person households over 65, 4% are female headed households and 27% are husband and wife households.

The average household size is 1.79 persons per household and the average family size is 2.81 persons per family.

In 2000, of the 20,814 households in NPU B, 13% had children under age 18 and 51% were single person households. The average household size was 1.82 persons per household.


2010 Household and Group Quarter Population: NPU B




99% of the NPU B population lives in households and 1% lives in Group Quarters.



HOUSING



NPU B has 30,973 housing units, an increase of 7,059 (29.5%) housing units from 23,914 in 2000. 85% are occupied and 15% are vacant. Rental units have 15% vacancy rate while owner occupied units have a 8% vacancy rate.



Of the occupied units, 46% are owner occupied and 54% are renter occupied. In 2000, 46% of the occupied units were owner occupied homes and 54% were renter occupied.

Renter occupied units have a smaller household size (1.63) than owner occupied units (1.98).
