

Public Meeting Monroe Drive/Boulevard Complete Streets February 28, 2017

PROJECT DESCRIPTION


The Monroe Drive/Boulevard Complete Streets project runs from Piedmont Circle on the north to Woodward Avenue on the south. Complete Streets are streets for everyone. They are designed and operated to enable safe access for all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists and transit riders of all ages and abilities. Complete Streets make it easy to cross the street, walk to shops, and bicycle to work. The Monroe Drive/Boulevard corridor has experienced high traffic volumes and safety issues associated with redevelopment and investment in the surrounding communities. This Complete Streets project will identify existing safety and mobility issues and develop corridor improvements to improve the safety and quality of life for all users.

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

The first public meeting for this project was held on August 23, 2016 and focused on providing the public with information on the project purpose and schedule, the existing conditions of the corridor, and recommendations from prior plans and studies. During that meeting, the public was given the opportunity to provide input on their corridor concerns and issues, modal priorities, locations of high concern/priority along the corridor, and suggestions for preferred improvements.

Based on the public input received and technical analyses conducted, preliminary improvement options have been developed and will be shared this evening and on the

Renew Atlanta website for review and comment by the public and other stakeholders. Input received on those preliminary improvement options will be used to develop a recommended concept for the corridor. That recommended concept will be shared with the public at a third public meeting to take place in late spring 2017.
