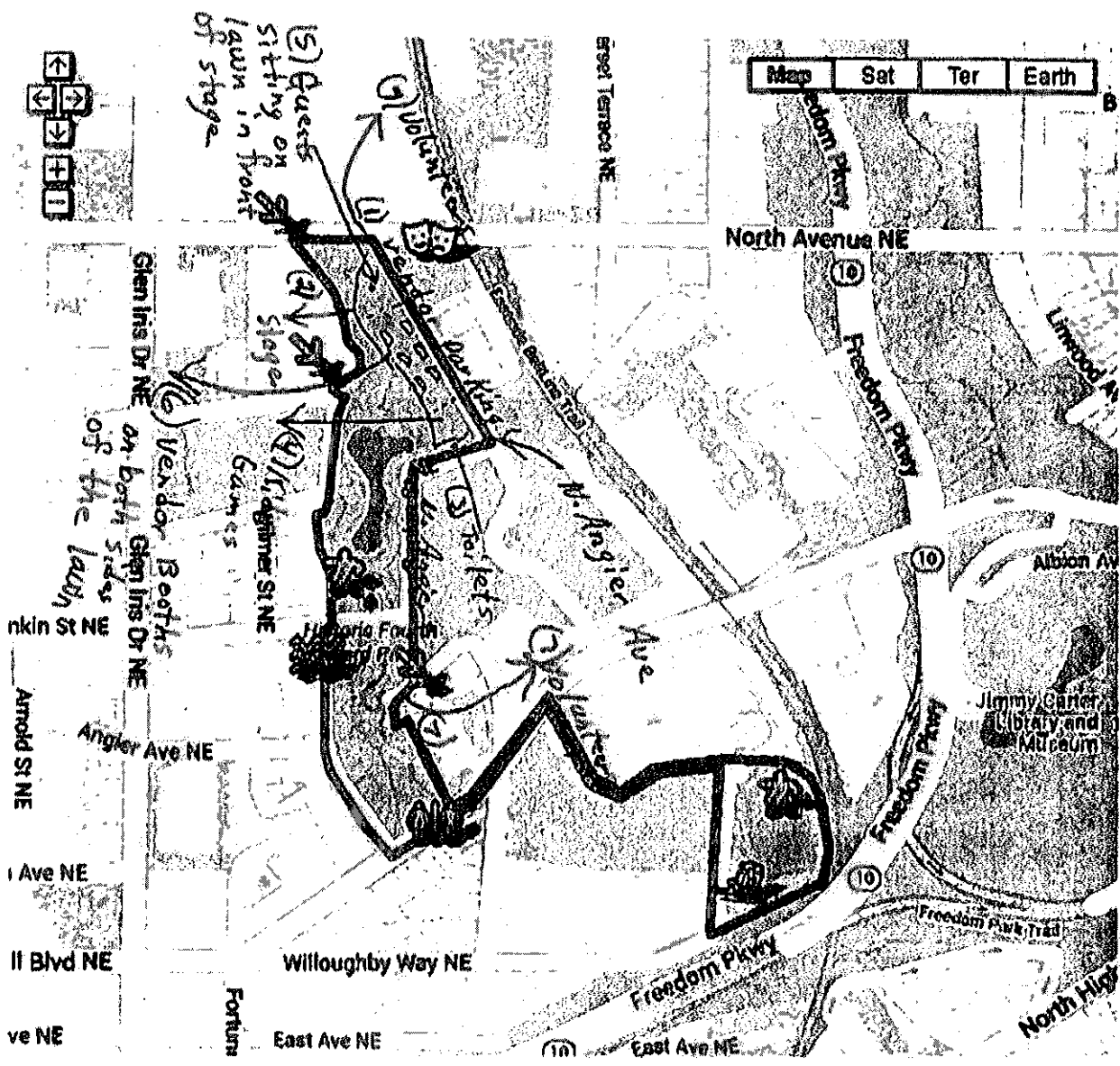


Historic Fourth Ward Map

- An outline of the entire event venue including the names of all streets or areas that are part of the venue and the surrounding area. If the event involves a moving route of any kind (i.e. parade, race, etc) indicate the route including the direction of travel and all street or lane closures.

Venue: Historic Old Fourth Ward Park

- a) Vendors will park on North Angier Ave next to the park for easy accessibility for unloading/loading supplies (see #1 on map)
- b) Streets involved: N. Angier Ave – used for vendor parking only. Signs will be posted on stakes along N. Angier Ave by 5:00 pm Fri. April 18, 2014 reading "NO PARKING Festival Parking, Sat April 19 from 6:00 am thru 6:00 pm" (see #1 on map)
- c) Vendors will set up in the central part of the lawn by N. Angier Ave. Each end of the lawn in this section, will be vendor booths (see #6 on map)
- d) Food vendors will be posted between non-food vendors
- e) All non-food vendors are required to sell at least one item made from the earth
- f) Native American Indians will kick off paying homage to Mother earth
- g) Yoga exercises will be performed, the audience will have the opportunity to join in
- h) Music and dances will occur throughout the festival
- i) Poetry reading will occur throughout the festival
- j) Speakers will present on the significance of utilizing our natural resources properly and better ways to save the "Earth"

- The location of fencing, barriers and/or barricades. Indicate any removable fencing for emergency access.

Barriers/Baricades

- a) No barricades or barriers – Two volunteers will be posted at each end of North Angier Ave directing vendors where to park (see #7 on map)

- The location and dimensions of all stages, platforms, scaffolding, bleachers, grandstands, canopies, tents, booths, amusements, dumpsters, and other temporary structures. The location of portable toilets, cooking areas, trash containers, generators, fuel tanks, banners, drinking water fountains or free water stations in park, waste grease containers and gray water containers.

Locations

- a) The stage is located on the oval walkway so that pedestrians can walk freely nearest North Ave. (see #2 on map) Size 24x24
