MAKE A **PET EMERGENCY KIT**



BE SURE TO INCLUDE:



Pet food



Water



Medications and medical records.



First aid kit: talk to your vet about what is most appropriate for your pet's emergency medical needs. Most kits include cotton bandage rolls, bandage tape and scissors, antibiotic ointment, flea and tick prevention, latex gloves.



Collar with ID tag, harness and leash: Your pet should always wear a collar with its rabies tag and identification. Keep a backup leash, collar and ID tag in the emergency supply kit.



Important documents: Place copies of your pets' registration information, adoption papers, vaccination documents and medical records in a clean plastic bag or waterproof container.



Crate or other pet carrier.



Sanitation: Include pet litter and a litter box if appropriate, newspapers, paper towels, plastic trash bags and a disinfectant.



A picture of you and your pet together: It helps document ownership and allows others to assist you in identifying your pet. Include detailed information about species, breed, age, sex, color and distinguishing characteristics.



Familiar items: Put favorite toys, treats or bedding in your kit to help reduce stress for your pet.
