HURRICANES: HOW AND WHY ATLANTA SHOULD BE PREPARED



Hurricane Season is from June 1 - November 1. While coastal residents face the most danger in the event of a tropical storm or hurricane, residents who live further inland face the possibility of:

Strong Winds 🍠 Heavy Rain 💋 Inland Flooding

Know how to be prepared in the event that we are impacted by a hurricane in the City of Atlanta:

- Develop a Family Disaster Plan.
- Por real time emergency weather notifications, sign up for NotifyATL.
- Assemble a Disaster Supplies Kit.
- Protect your property prior to the storm: trim trees and shrubbery, make trees more wind resistant by removing diseased and damaged limbs, clear loose and clogged rain gutters and downspouts. If you live in a flood plain or are prone to flooding, follow flood preparedness precautions.
- If told to evacuate, tell someone outside of the storm area where you are going.
- Protect your property financially from destructive storms by purchasing an insurance policy tailored to your needs. You can purchase NFIP flood insurance directly from any state-licensed property and casualty insurance agent or insurance company.
- After a storm, make a list of any property damage and document with photos/video for insurance claims.
