DRIVING IN EXTREME COLD & SNOWSTORMS

SHOULD YOU STAY OR GO?

STAY:

- If you're stuck on the road to avoid exposure and/or rescue is likely.
- If a safe location is neither nearby or visible.
- If you do not have the appropriate clothing to go outside.
- If you do not have the ability to call for help.


GO:

- Give yourself enough time to get to your work location.
- Move into warm locations during breaks.
- Walk slowly to avoid slips, trips and falls.
- Wear a hat to reduce the loss of body heat, cover your mouth with a scarf to protect your lungs.



ICE AND SNOW, TAKE IT SLOW!

Slower speed, slower acceleration and slower braking. For a car traveling 35 mph, the thinking and braking distance increases as weather worsens.
