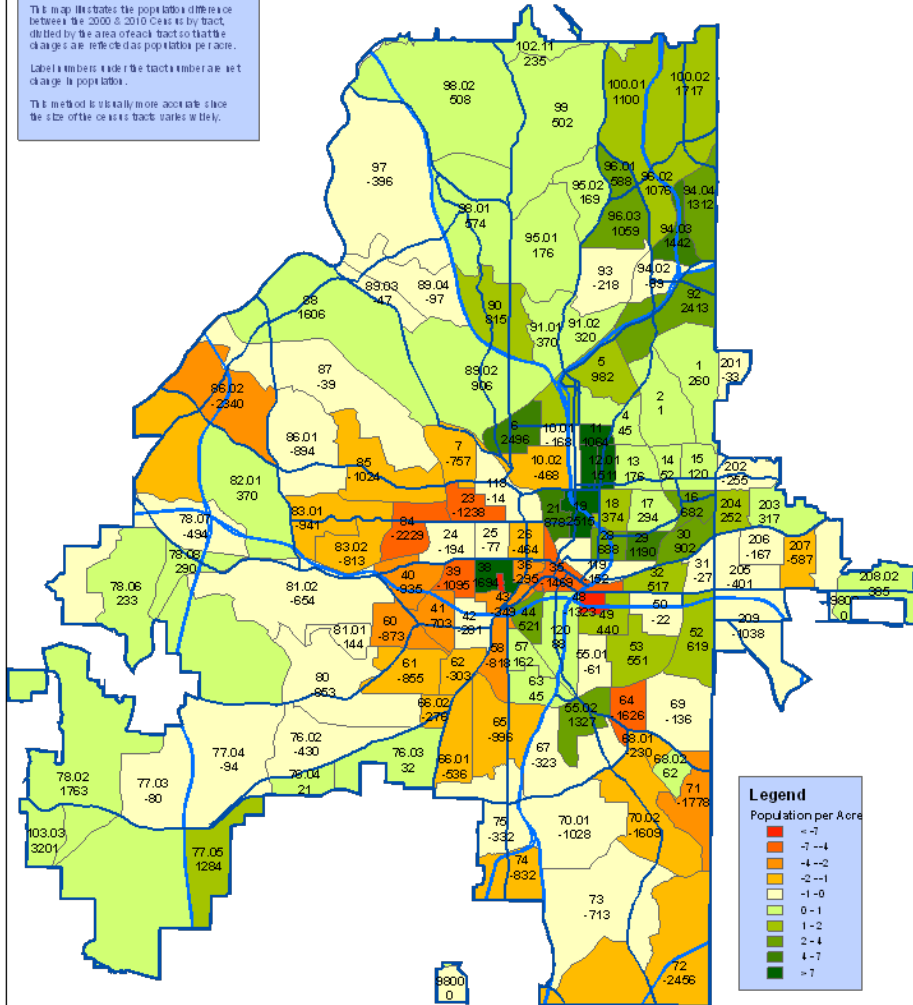
City of Atlanta: Population Change 2000 - 2010

This map illustrates the population difference between the 2000 & 2010 Censuses by tract, divided by the area of each tract so that the changes are reflected as population per acre.

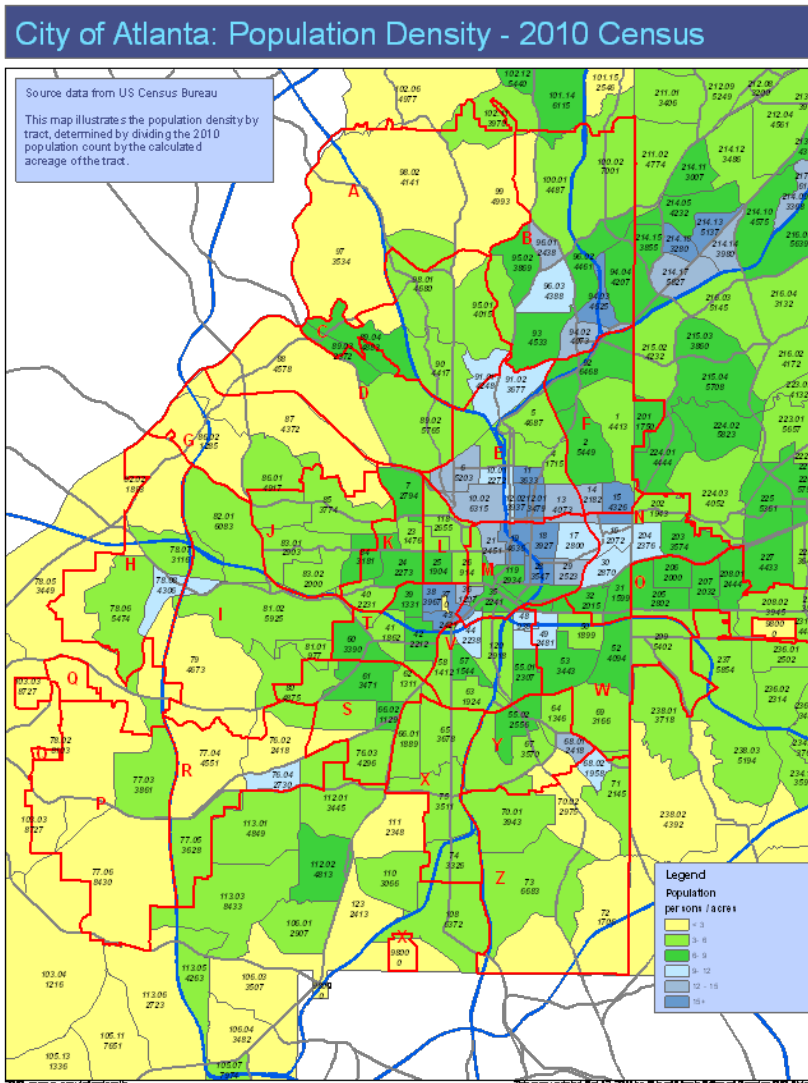
Labels numbers under the tracts number net change in population.

This method is usually more accurate since the size of the census tract varies widely.



- 2010 City of Atlanta Population – 420,003
- Increase of 3,529 or 0.8%
- Net In-Migration – 38,818
- Net Out-Migration – 35,195
- 63 Tracts gained population
 - Tract 103.03 (SW Atlanta) Largest number gain – 3,201
 - Tract 19 (Downtown/North Ave) Largest percent gain- 118%
- 68 Tracts lost population
 - Tract 72 (South/NPU Z) largest number loss – 2,456
 - Tract 37 (University Homes) largest percent loss 100%

Population Density

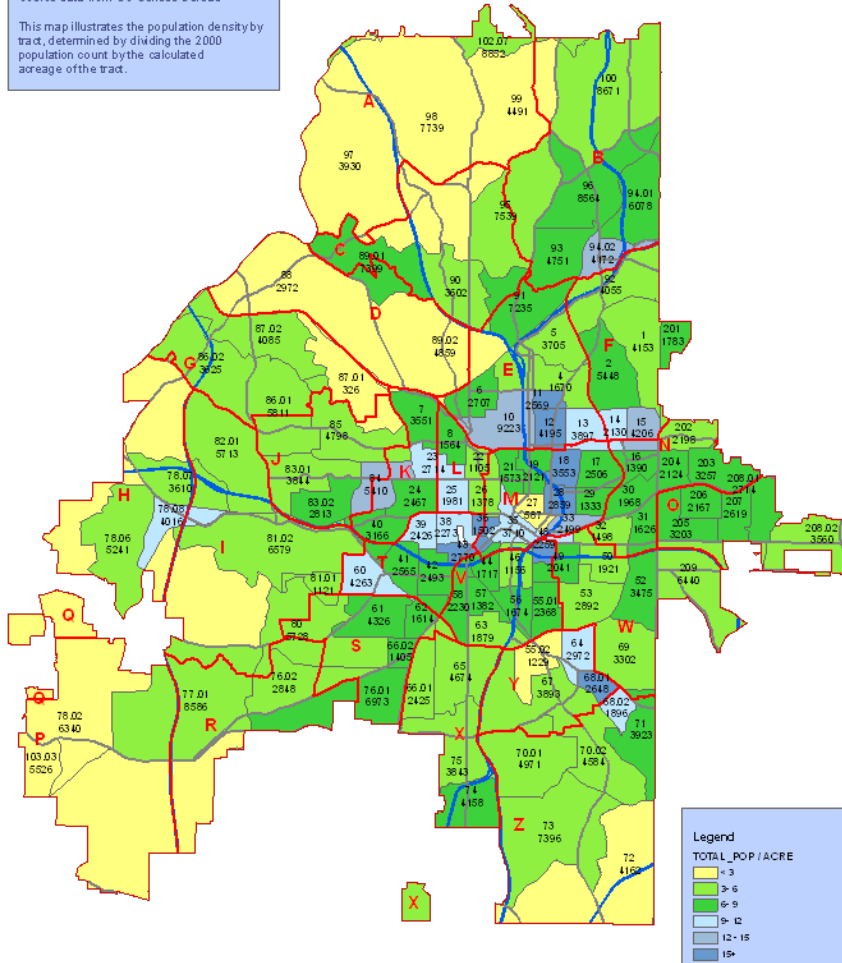


- The population density ranges from 1.13 persons per acre in Northwest Atlanta to 33.1 persons per acre in Midtown
- The median density is 4.6 persons per acre.

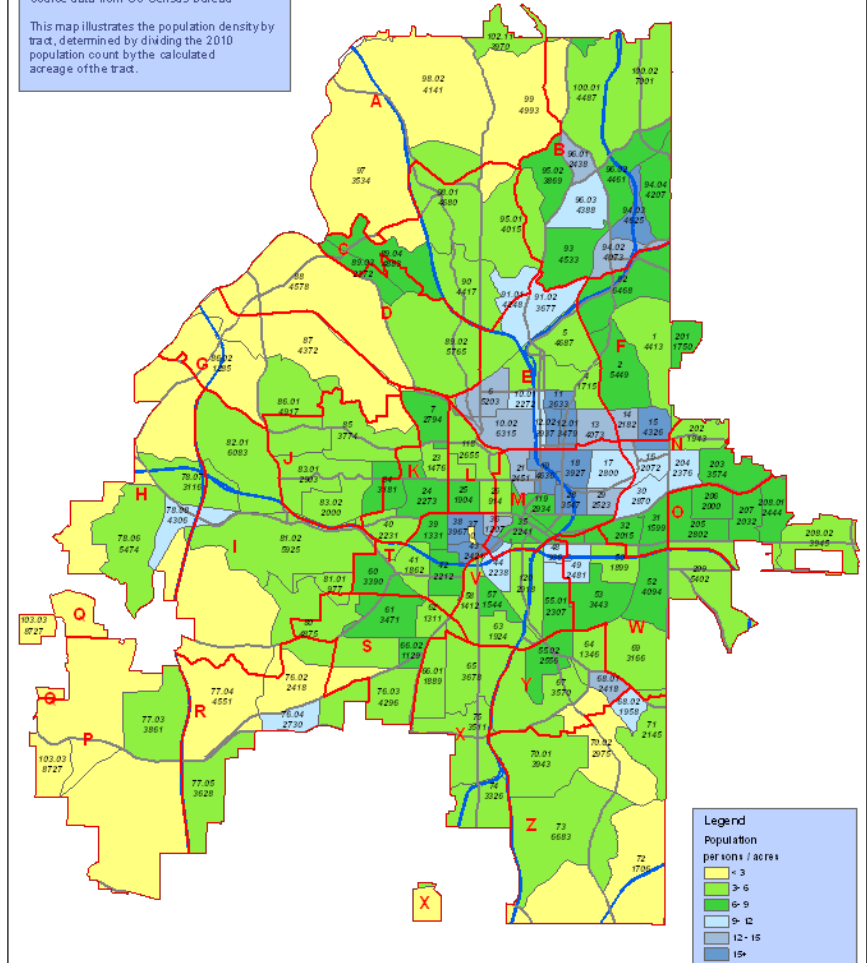
This map illustrates the population density by tract, determined by dividing the 2000 population count by the calculated acreage of the tract.

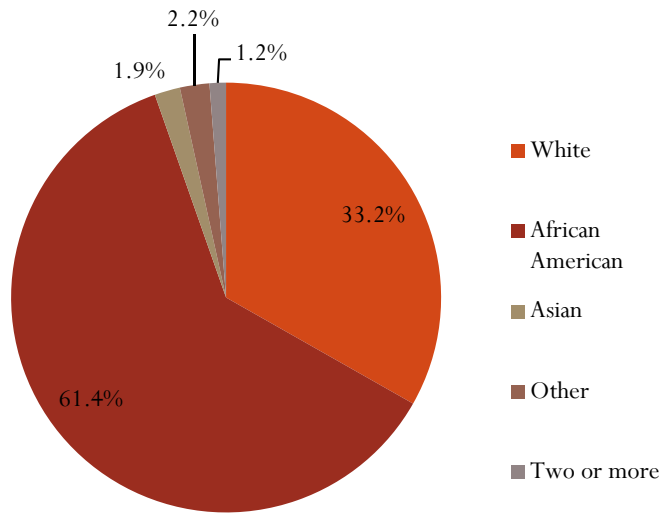

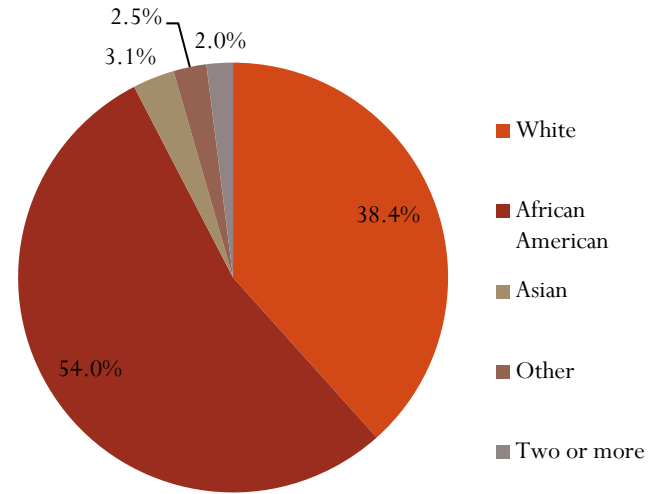

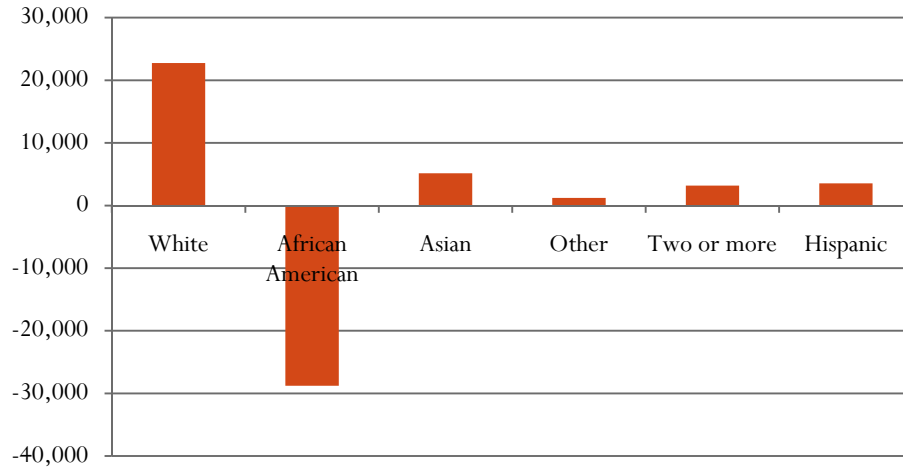
2000 COA Racial Composition

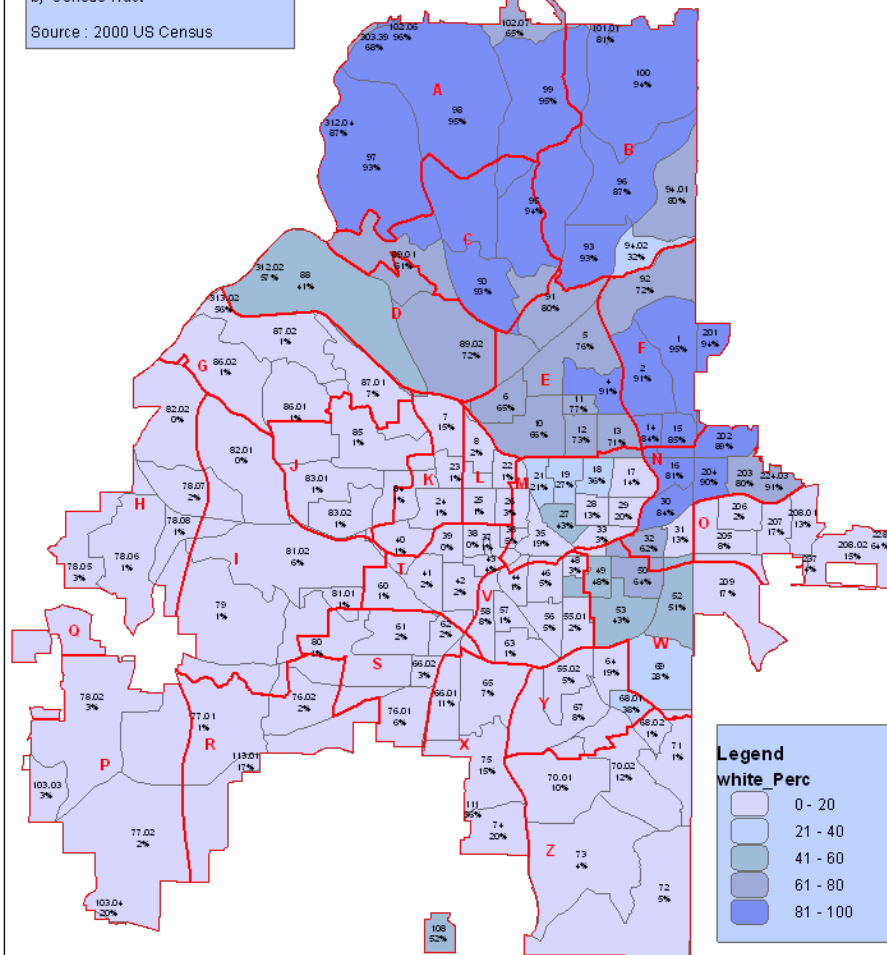

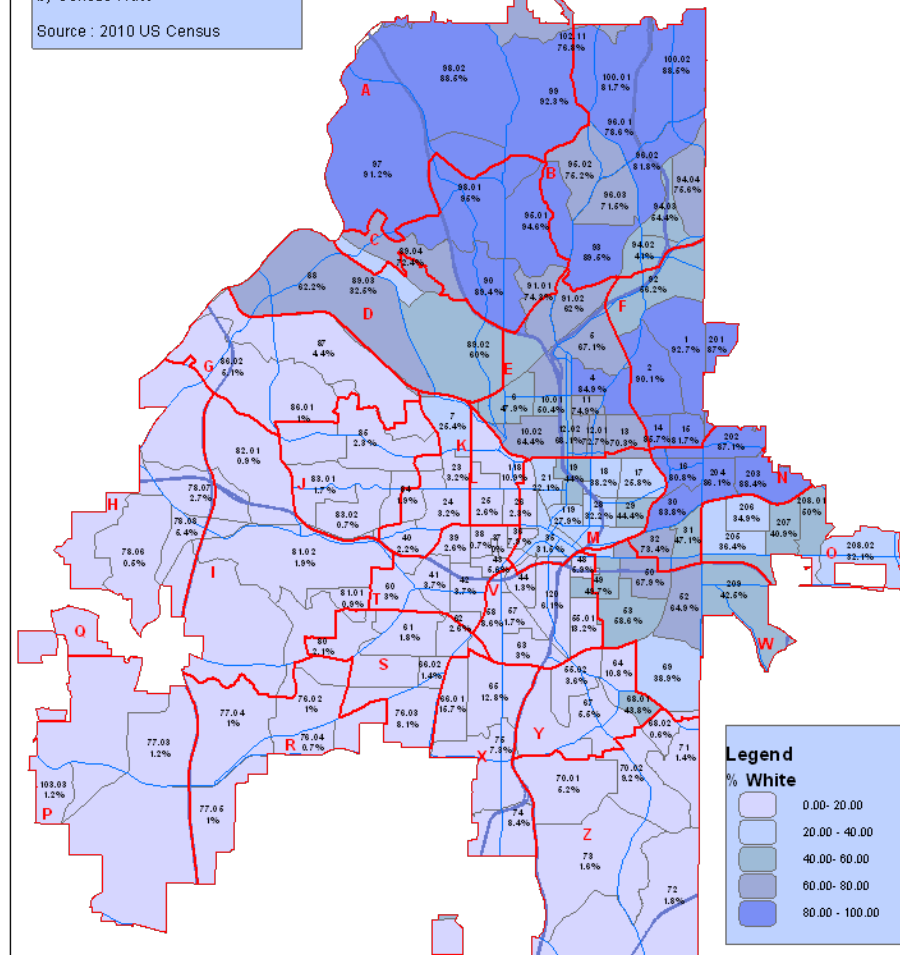

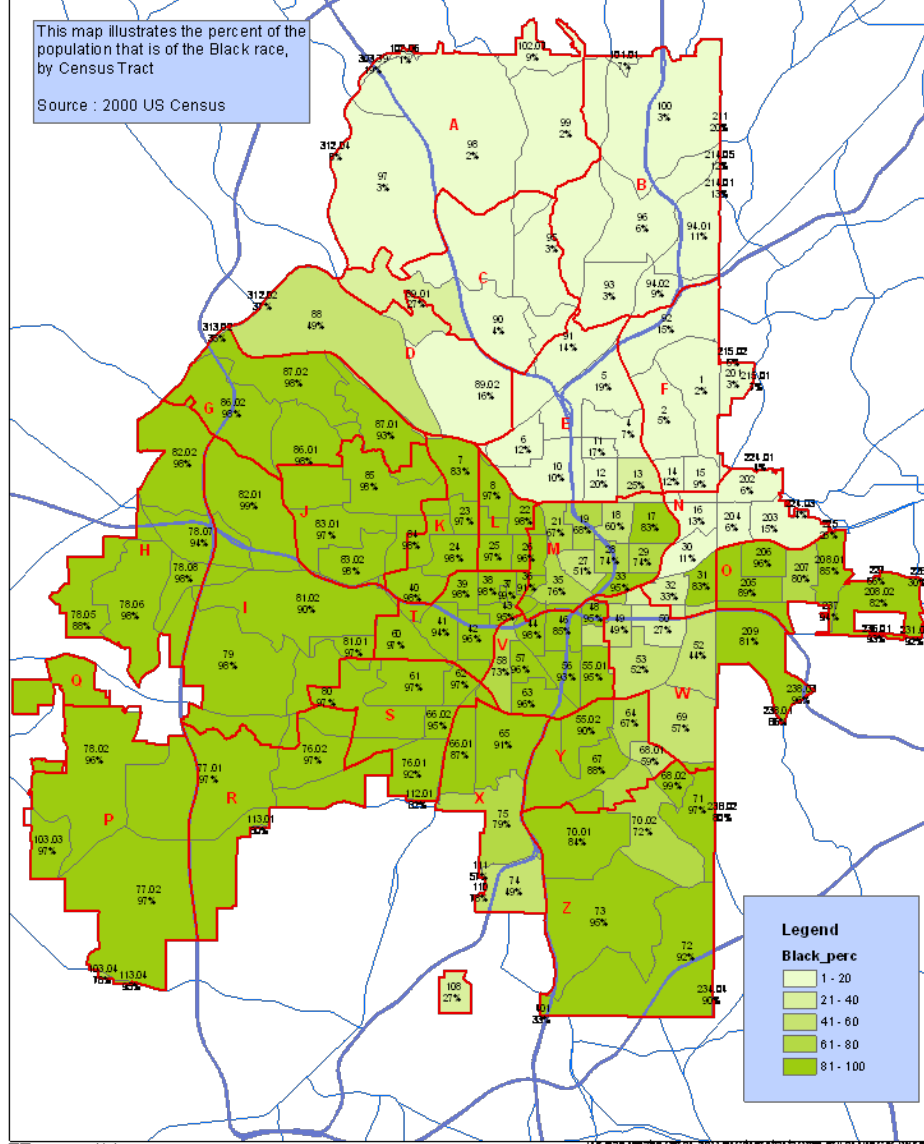

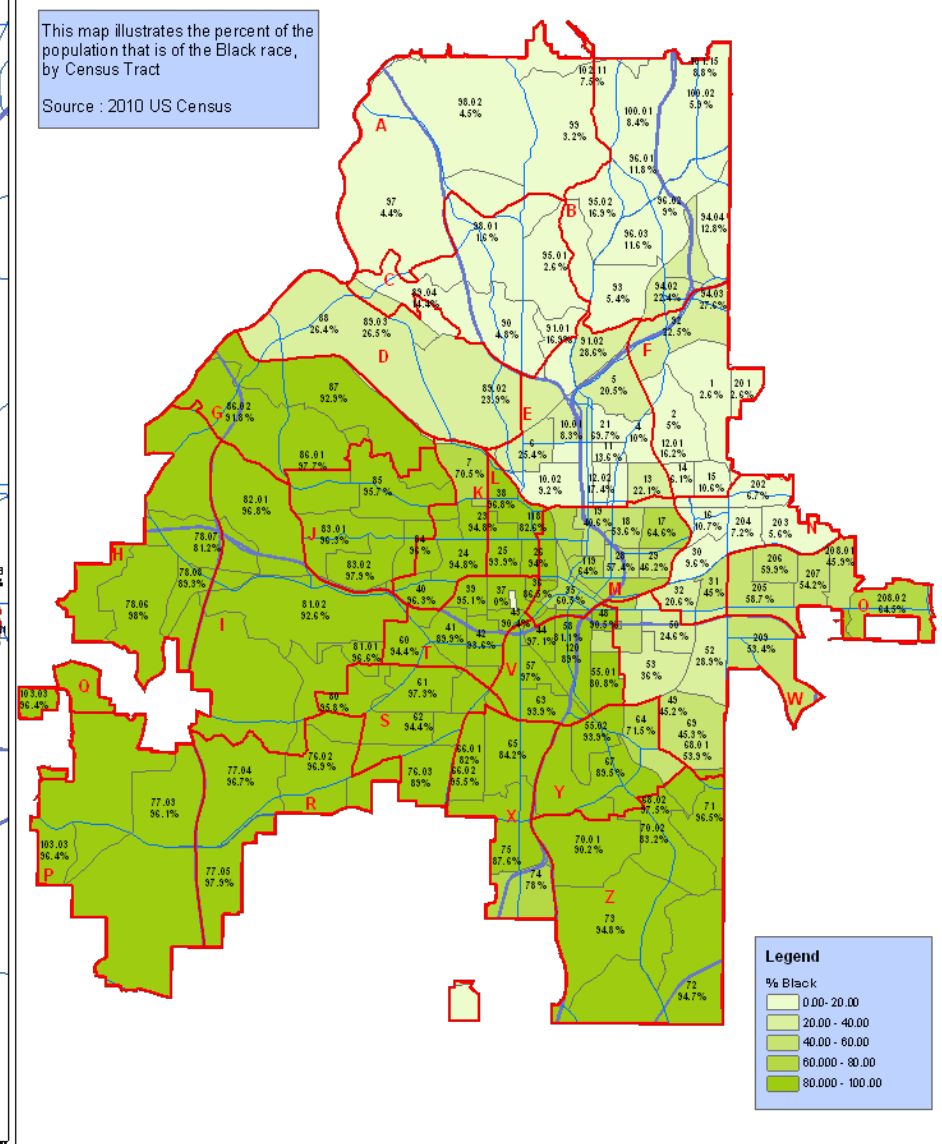

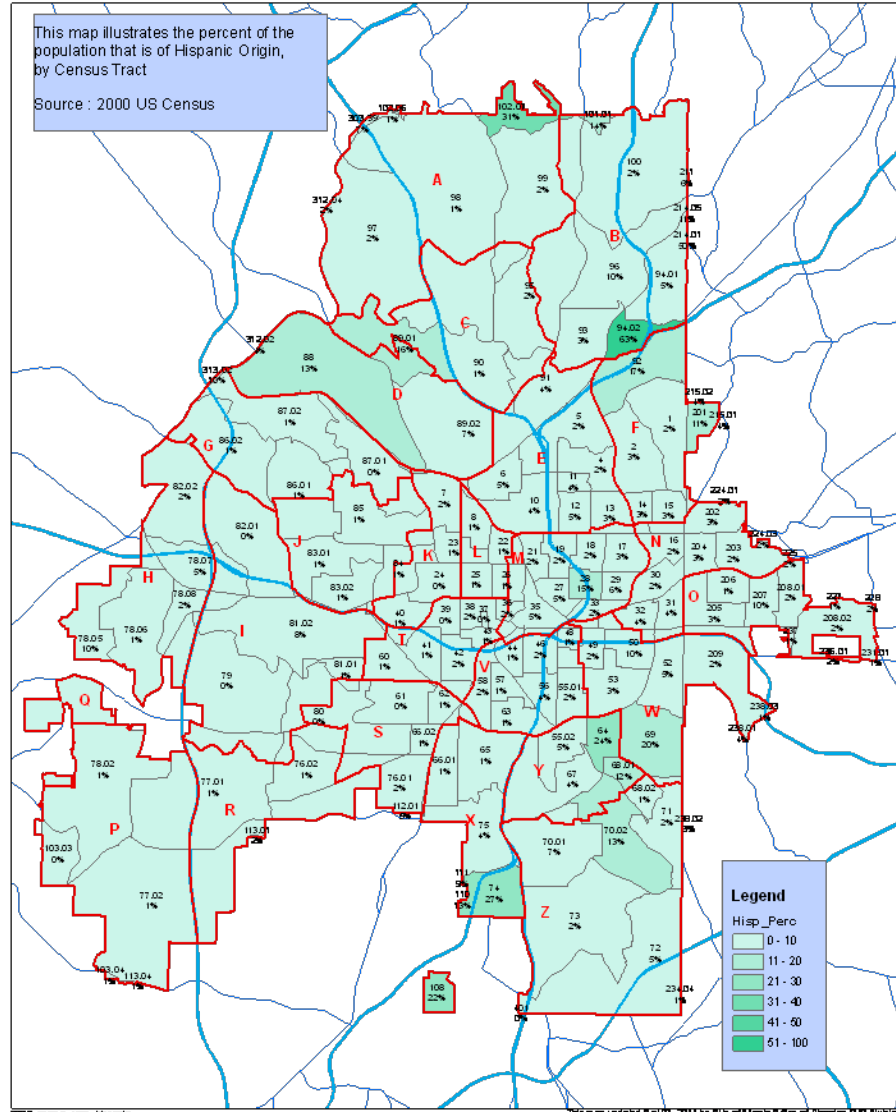

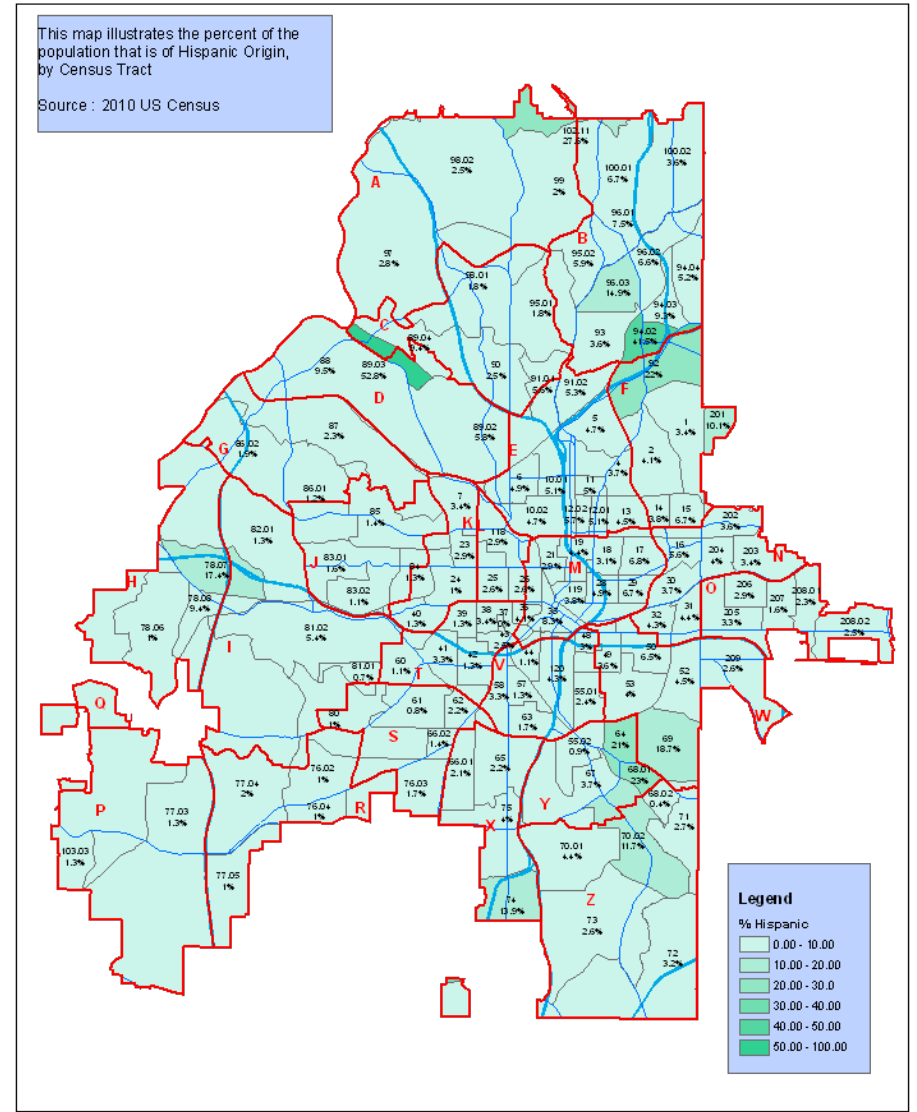

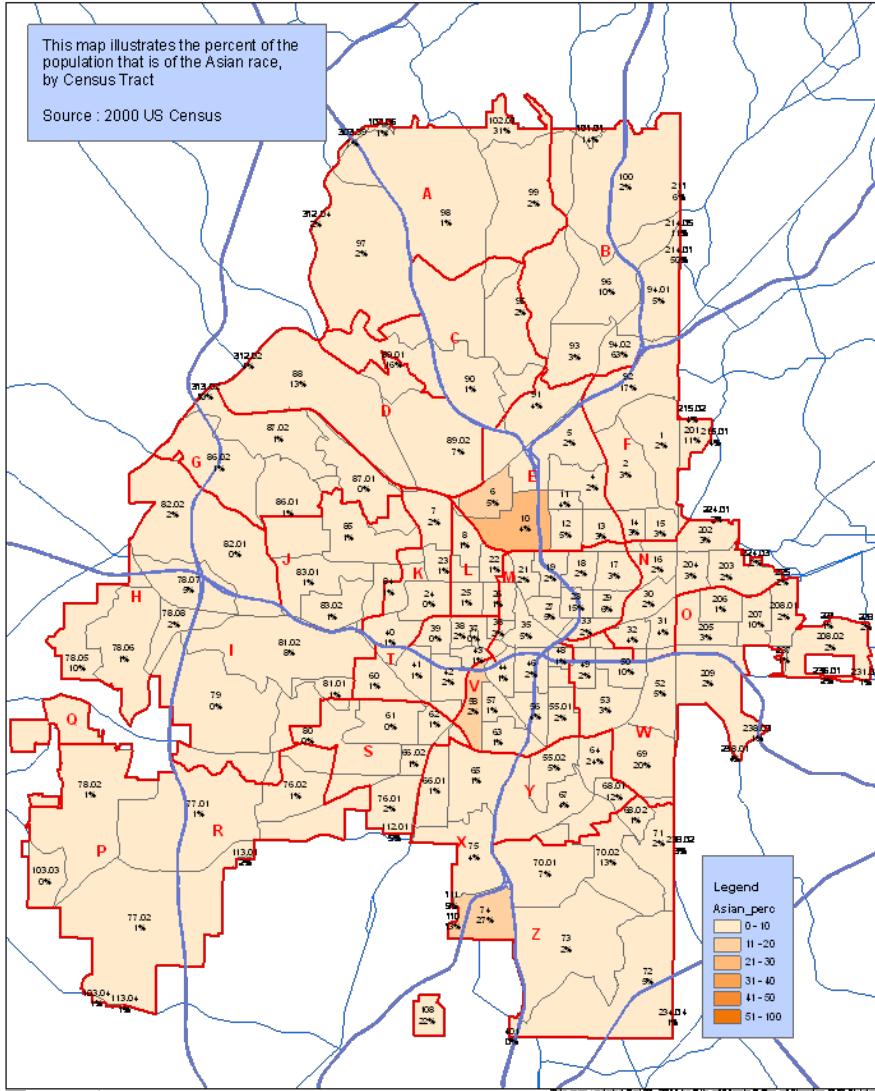

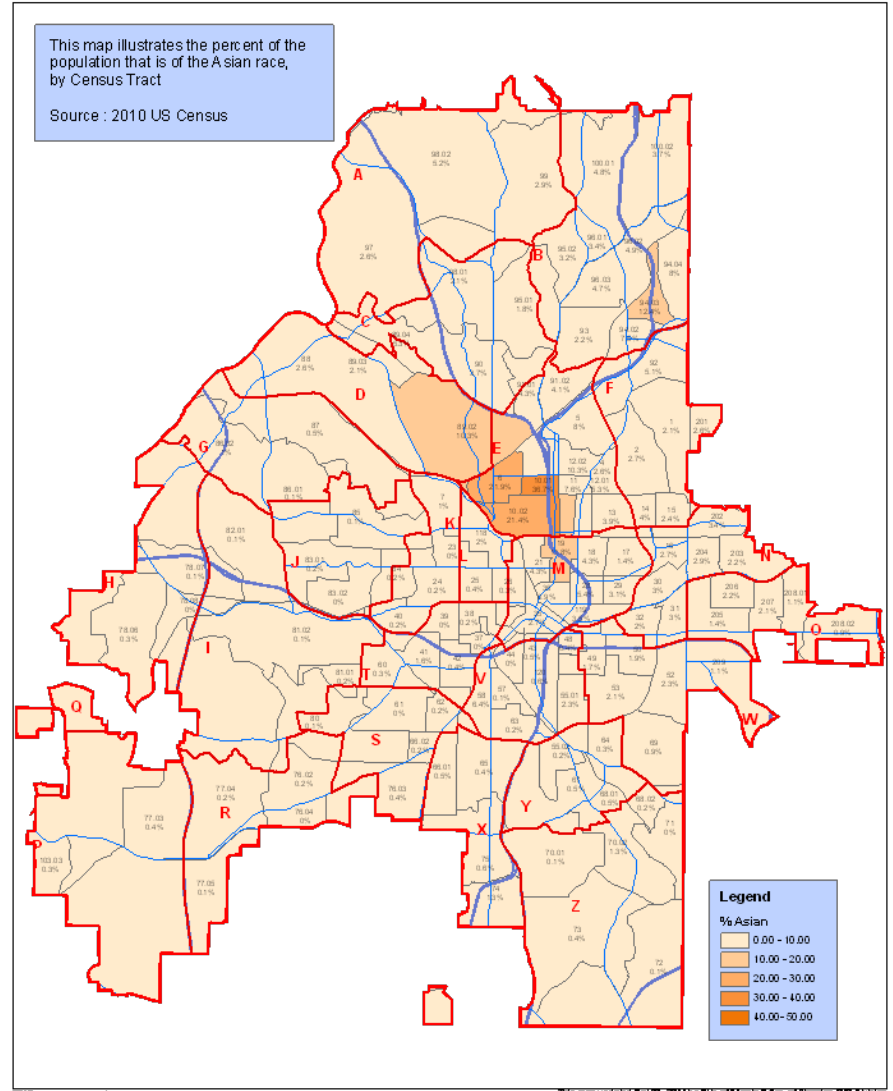

This map illustrates the percent of the population that is of the Asian race, by Census Tract

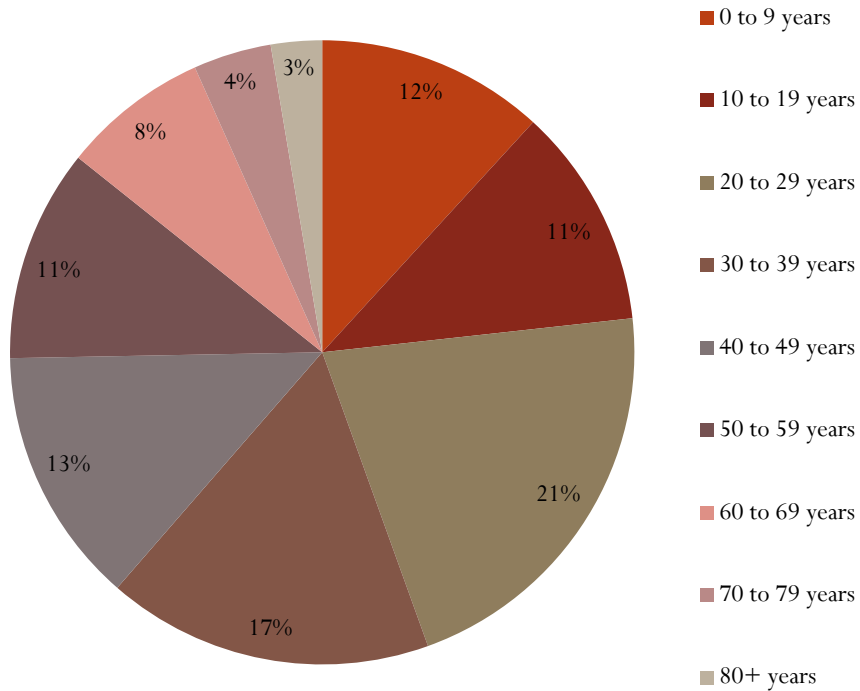

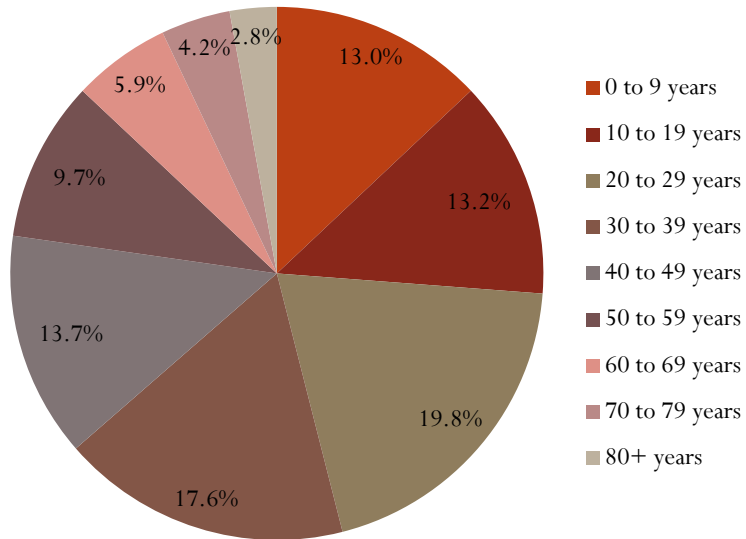
2010 COA Age Structure



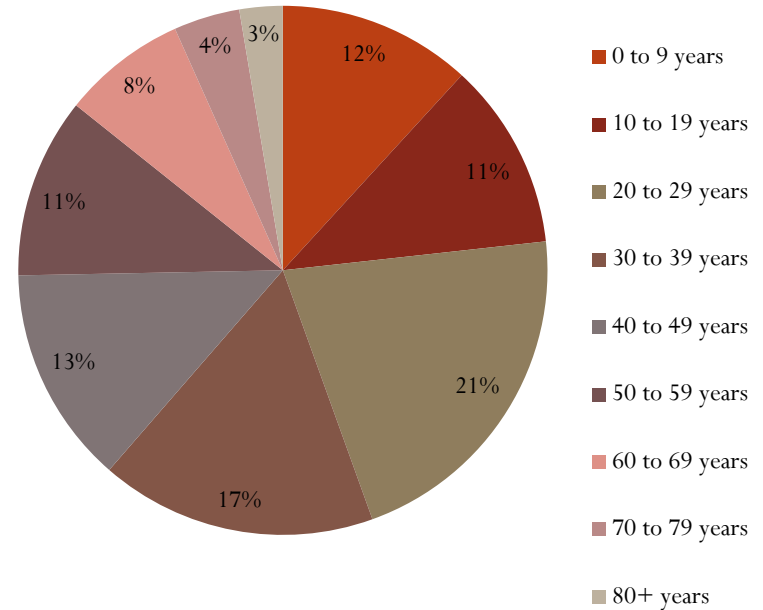
- **The median age of the population is 32.9, an increase from 31.9 in 2000.**

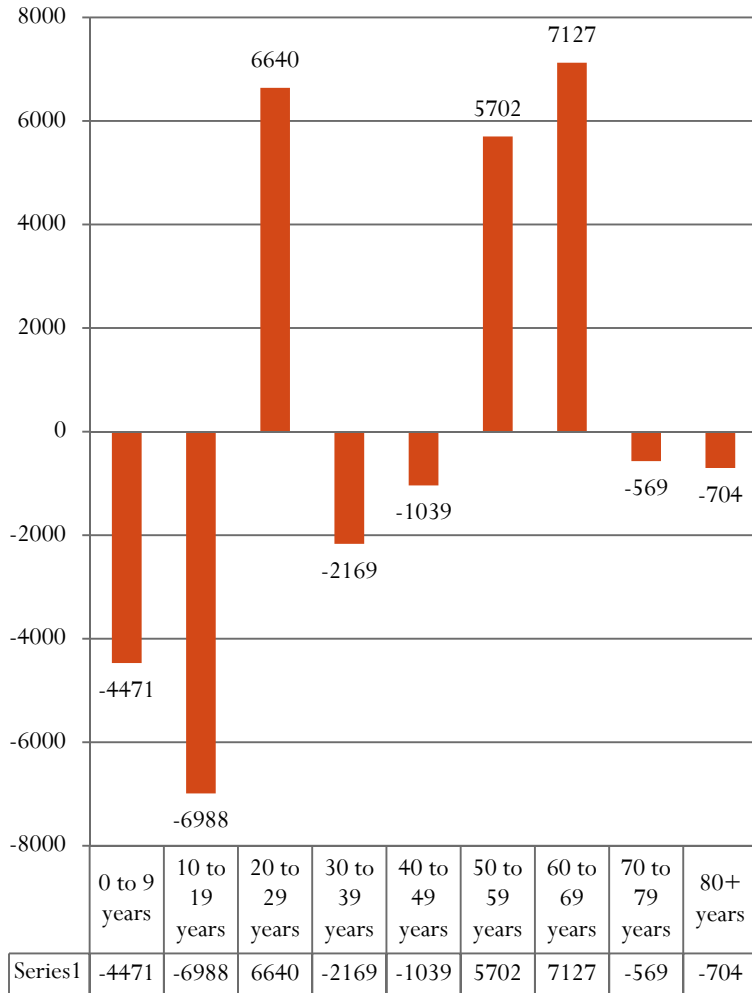

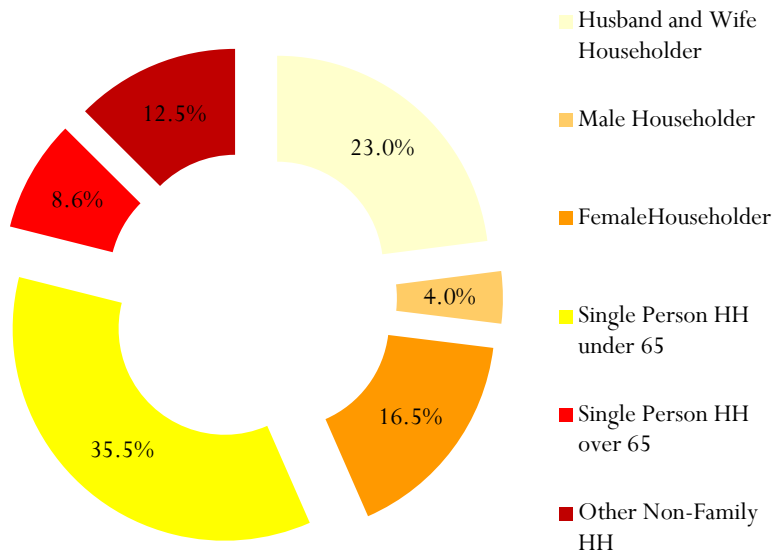

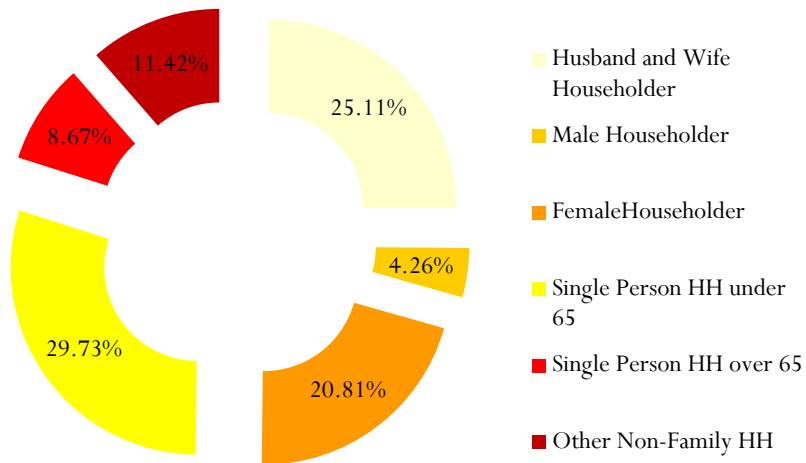

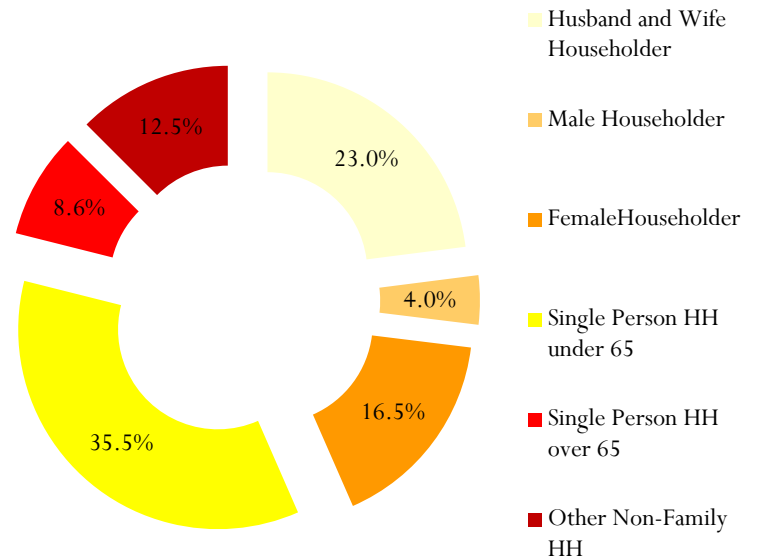
- There are 390,519 City of Atlanta residents in 185,142 households.

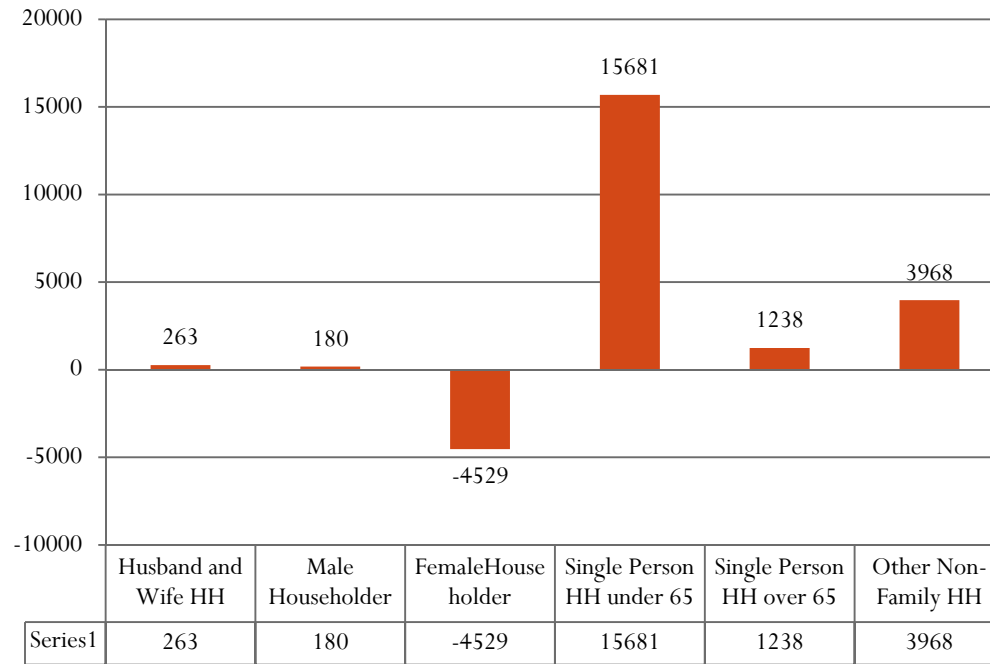

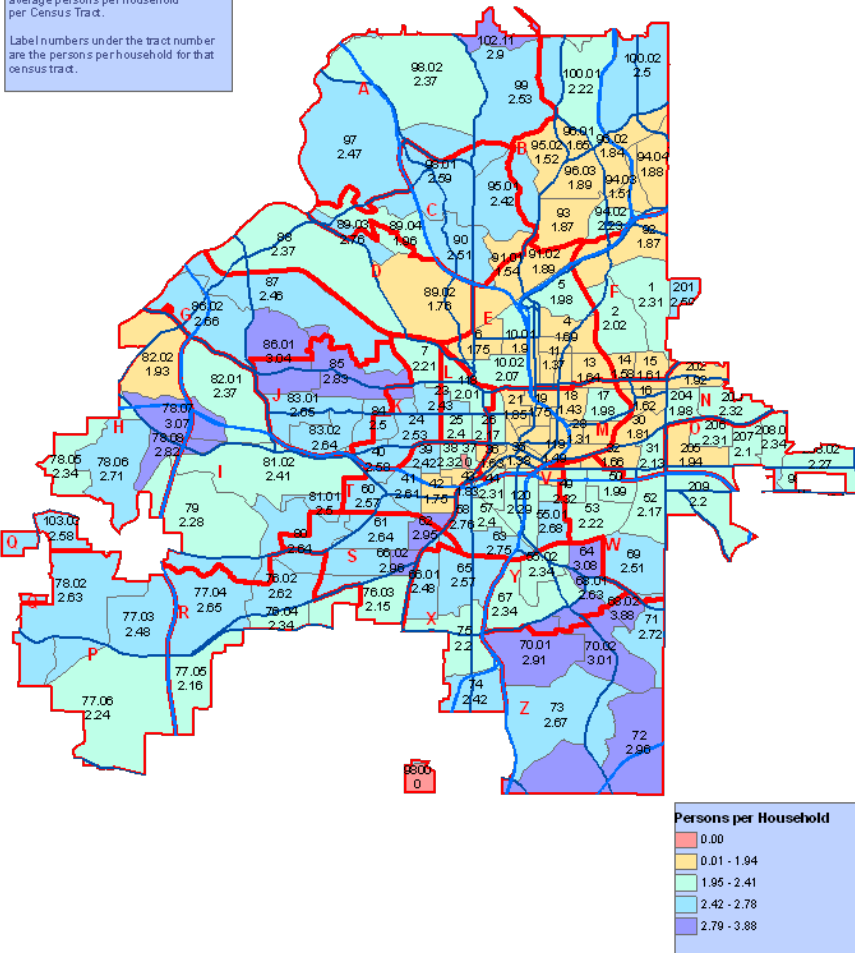

- The average household size has been declining over the past decades from 2.4 in 1990 to 2.3 in 2000 to 2.11 in 2010.
- The largest household size is 3.88 in Census Tract 68.02 in NPU Z.

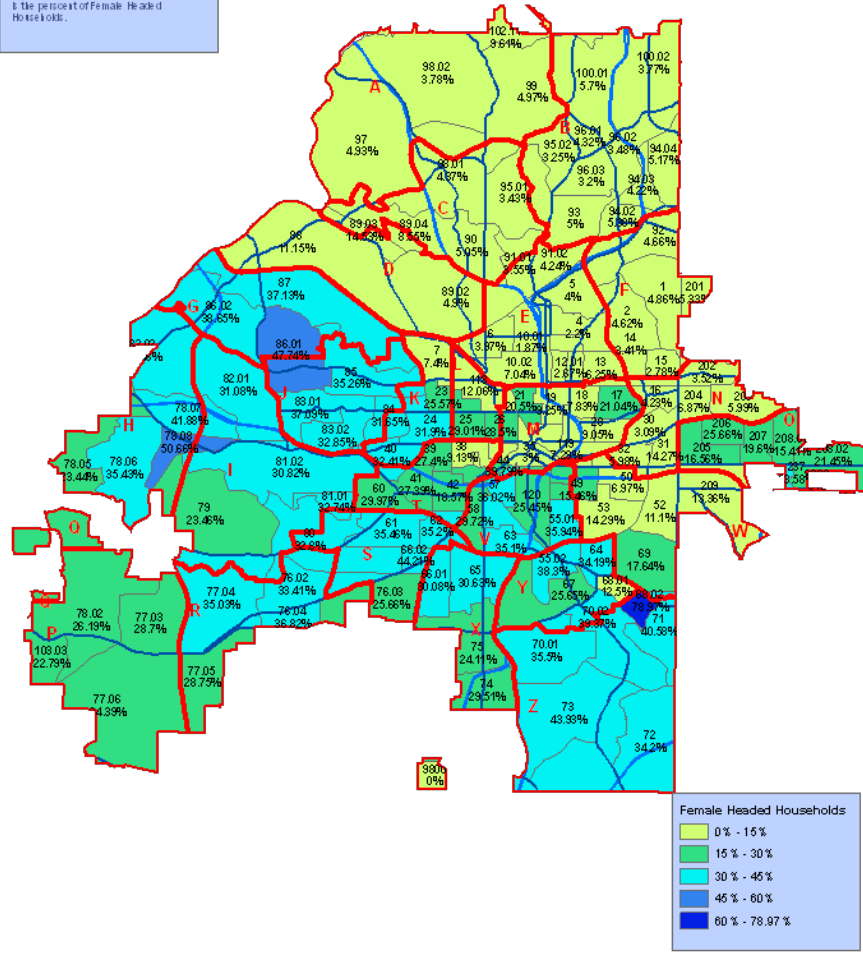

- In Census Tract 68.02 – NPU Z, 78% of households are headed by a female.

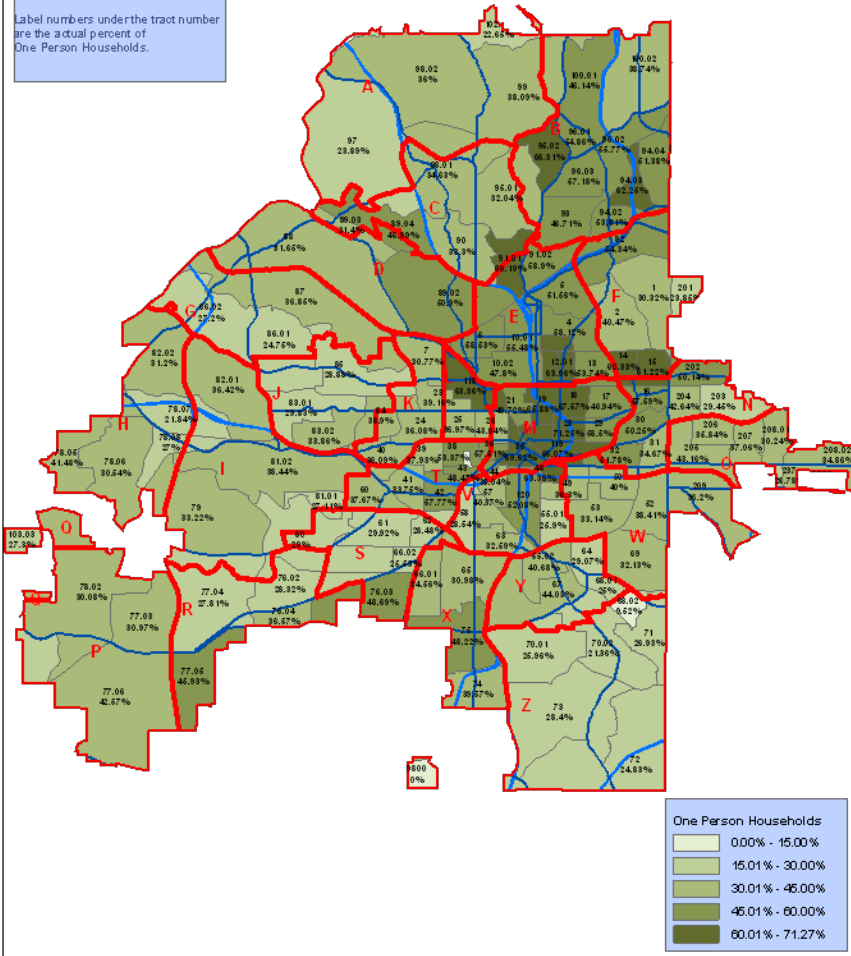

- In Census Tract 28 - NPU M, 71% of households are single person households.

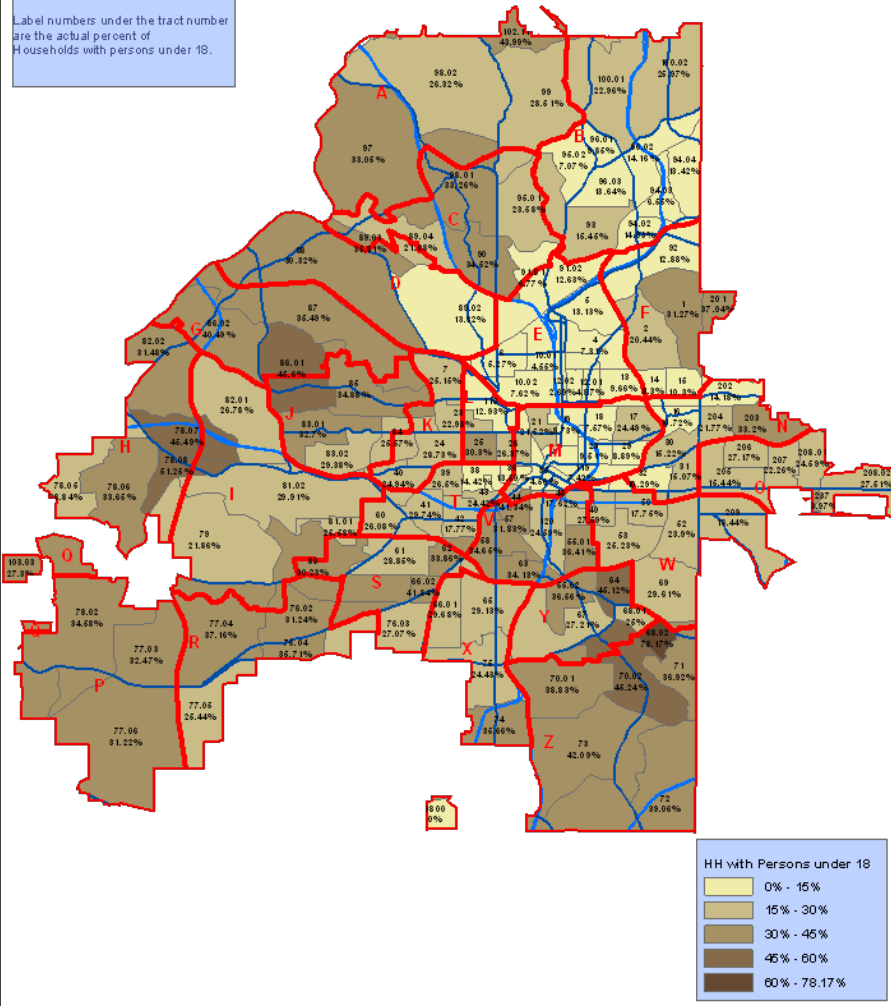

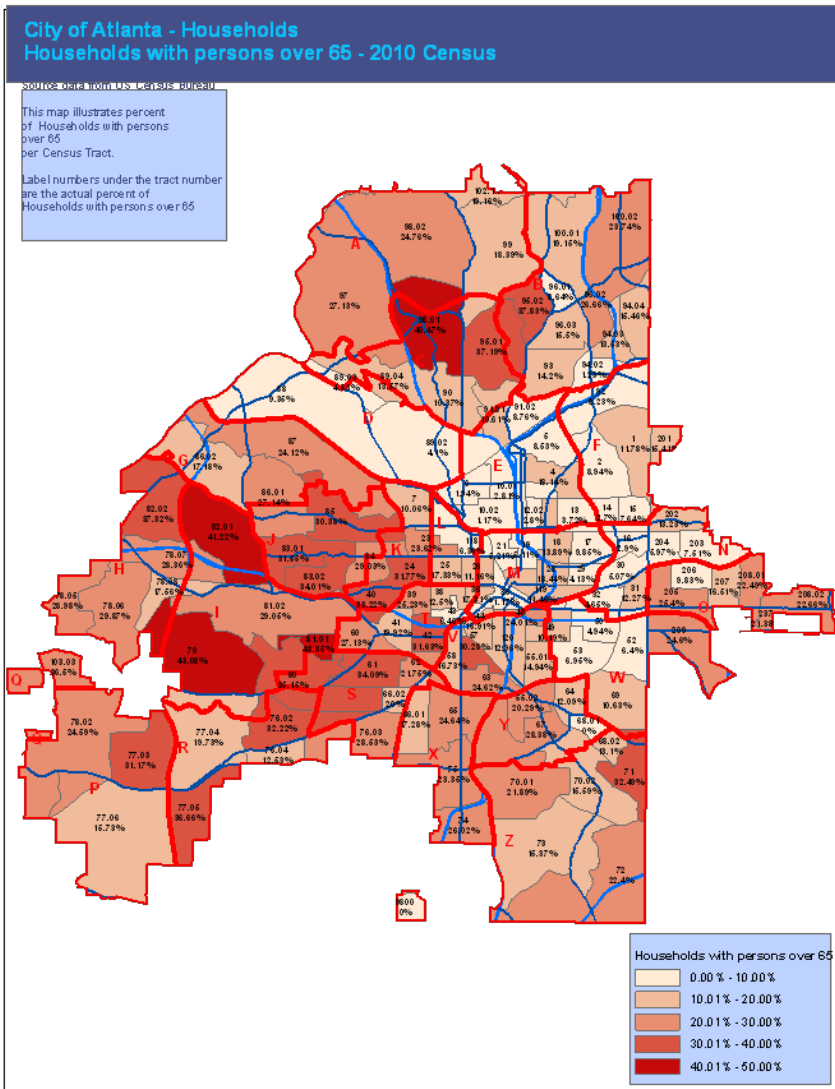
This map illustrates percent of Households with persons under 18 per Census Tract.

- A decline of 4.8% from 2000.

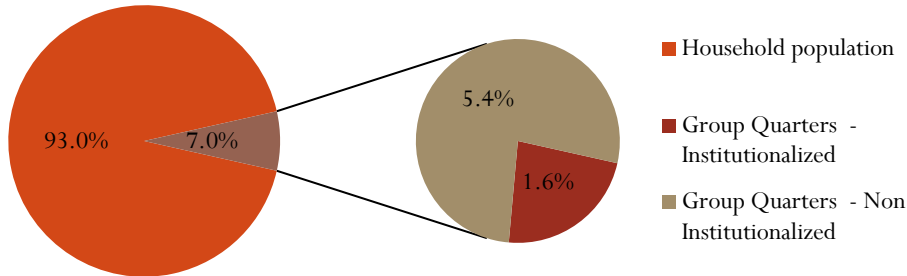
Households with persons 65 and over



- 17.8% of households have a person 65 years and older. A decline of 0.5% from 2000.
- In Census Tract 81.01, 49% of households have a person 65 and over.

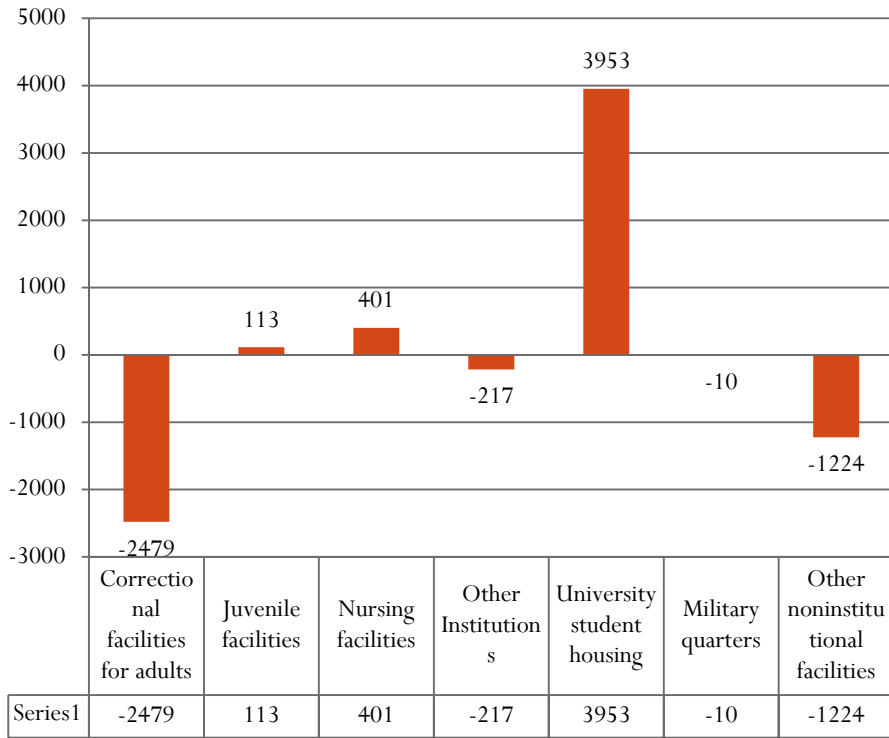
Household and Group Quarters Population



- 7% or 29,484 of the population live in group quarters.
- Almost 60% of the group quarter population lives in student housing (non-institutionalized group quarters).
- Correctional facilities are the largest institutionalized group quarters, representing 17% of the group quarters population.

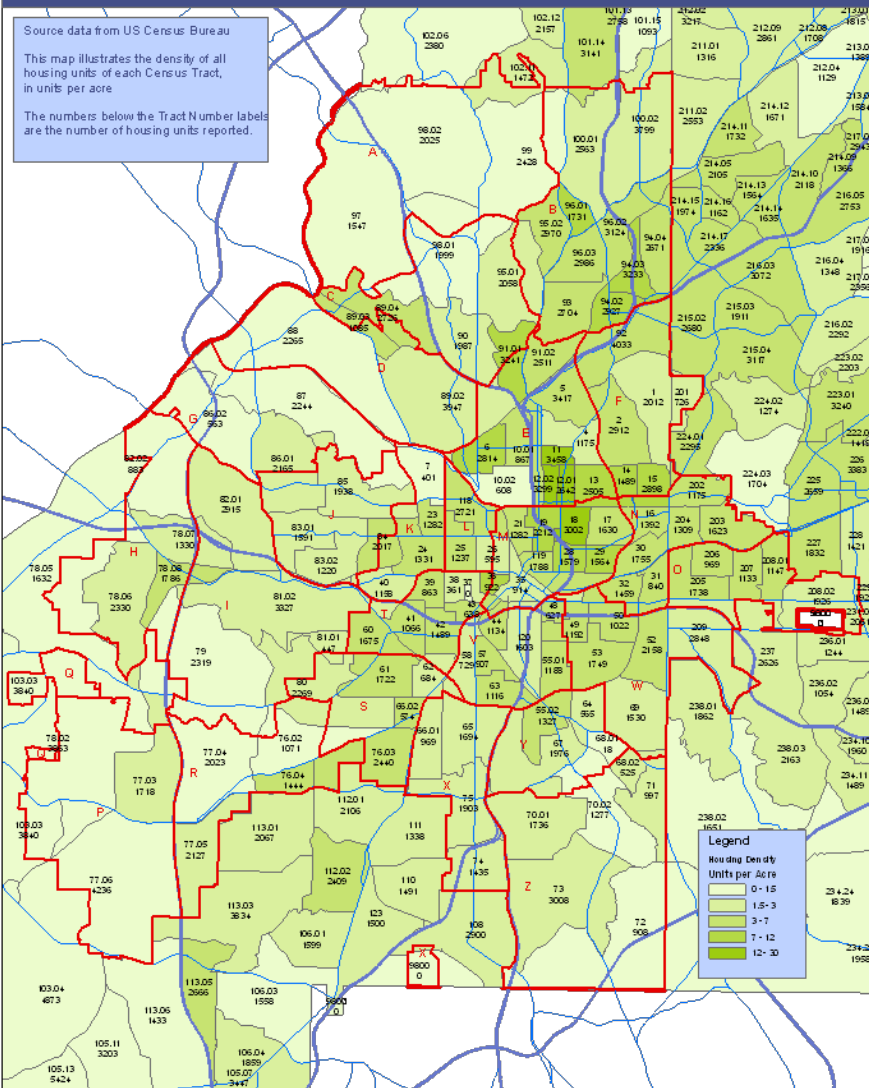

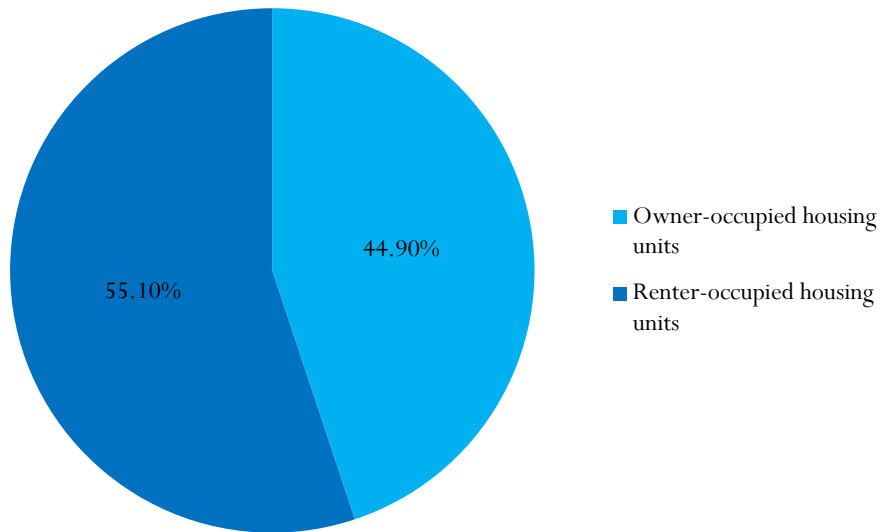
City of Atlanta: Total Housing Density 2010



- The City of Atlanta has 224,573 housing units.
- This is an increase of 20% or 37,648 units from 2000.
- The map shows the housing density by census tract (units per acre).
- The housing density ranges from 0 housing units per acre to 29.7 and the median is 2.1 units per acre.
- The highest housing densities are in Downtown, Midtown and in Buckhead.

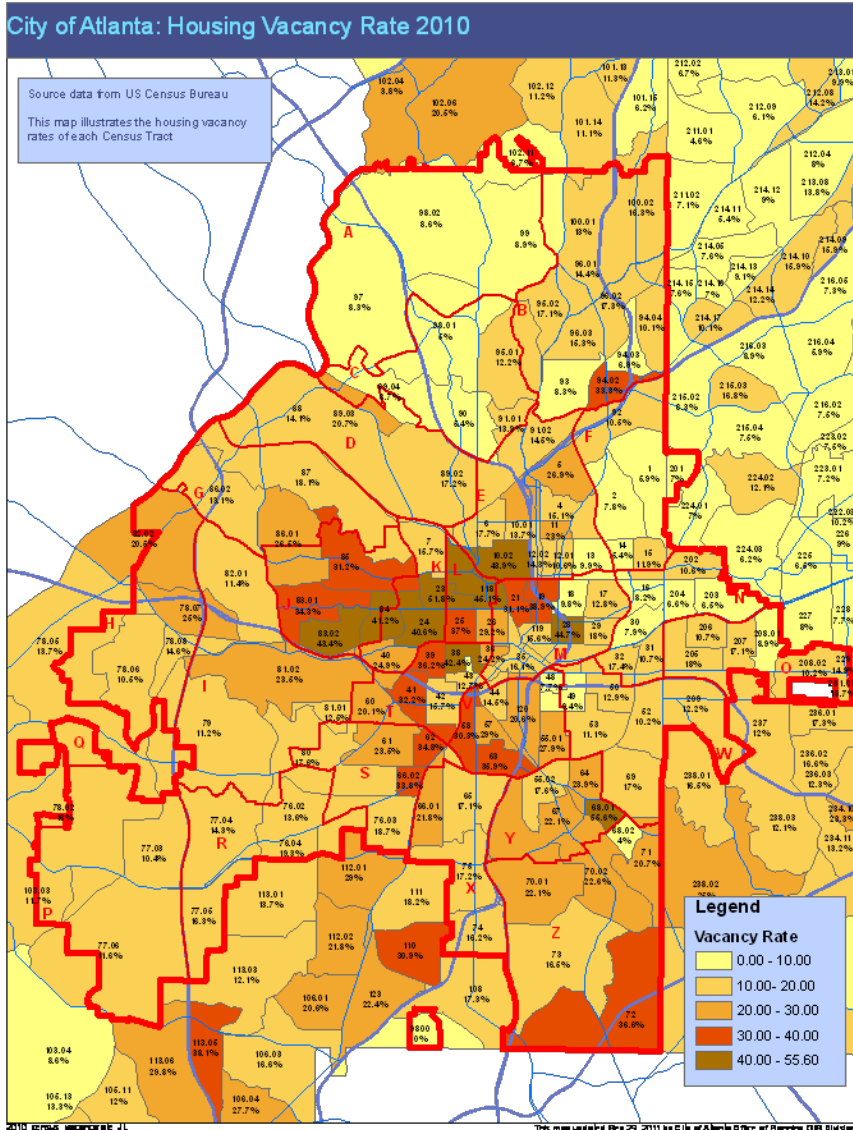

Housing Vacancy



- A little over 17% or 39,431 of housing units in the City of Atlanta are vacant.
- This is a sharp increase from 2000 when 10% or 18,778 units were vacant.
- The vacancy rate for rental units was 15%, higher than the 7% vacancy rate for owner-occupied units.
- Vacancy rates range from a low of 5% to a high of 55%.

Count Question Resolution

- The 2010 Census Count Question Resolution (CQR) Program is a mechanism for government units to challenge census population counts
- The CQR Program will address questions about **housing unit** and **group quarters** counts for three types of challenges:
 - *Boundary (i.e. difference in city boundary limits)*
 - *Geocoding (i.e. population misallocated)*
 - *Coverage (i.e. missed or too many addresses)*

The Census will NOT allow you to challenge:

- Total Population Count
- Household Size
- Demographic Characteristics

Count Question Resolution

- Count Question Resolution will accept challenge submissions from governmental units beginning **June 1, 2011** to **June 1, 2013**.
- It is important to note that the Census Bureau will not collect any additional data or conduct additional surveys during this challenge process.
- Revision to the population and housing unit counts will result in the issuance of new certified 2010 Census counts. The US Census Bureau will use the CQR corrections to modify population estimated beginning in December 2012.

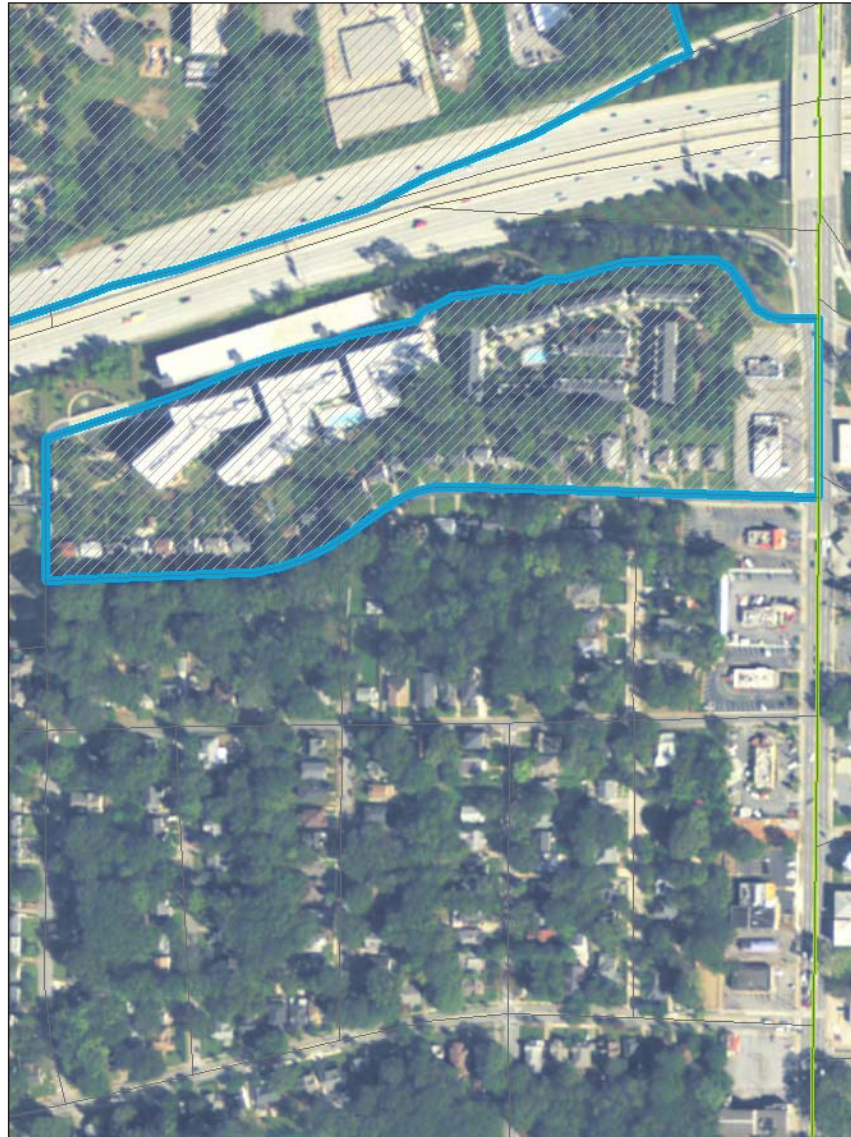
Count Question Resolution

- To date 73 cities have challenged the 2010 Census following the CQR process. Some of these are: Miami, and Washington D.C. and 5 local governments in Georgia.
- Challenges need to be made at the Census Block level. There are approximately 6,600 Census Blocks in the City of Atlanta.
- The City of Atlanta is soliciting bids to assist with challenging the 2010 Census.
