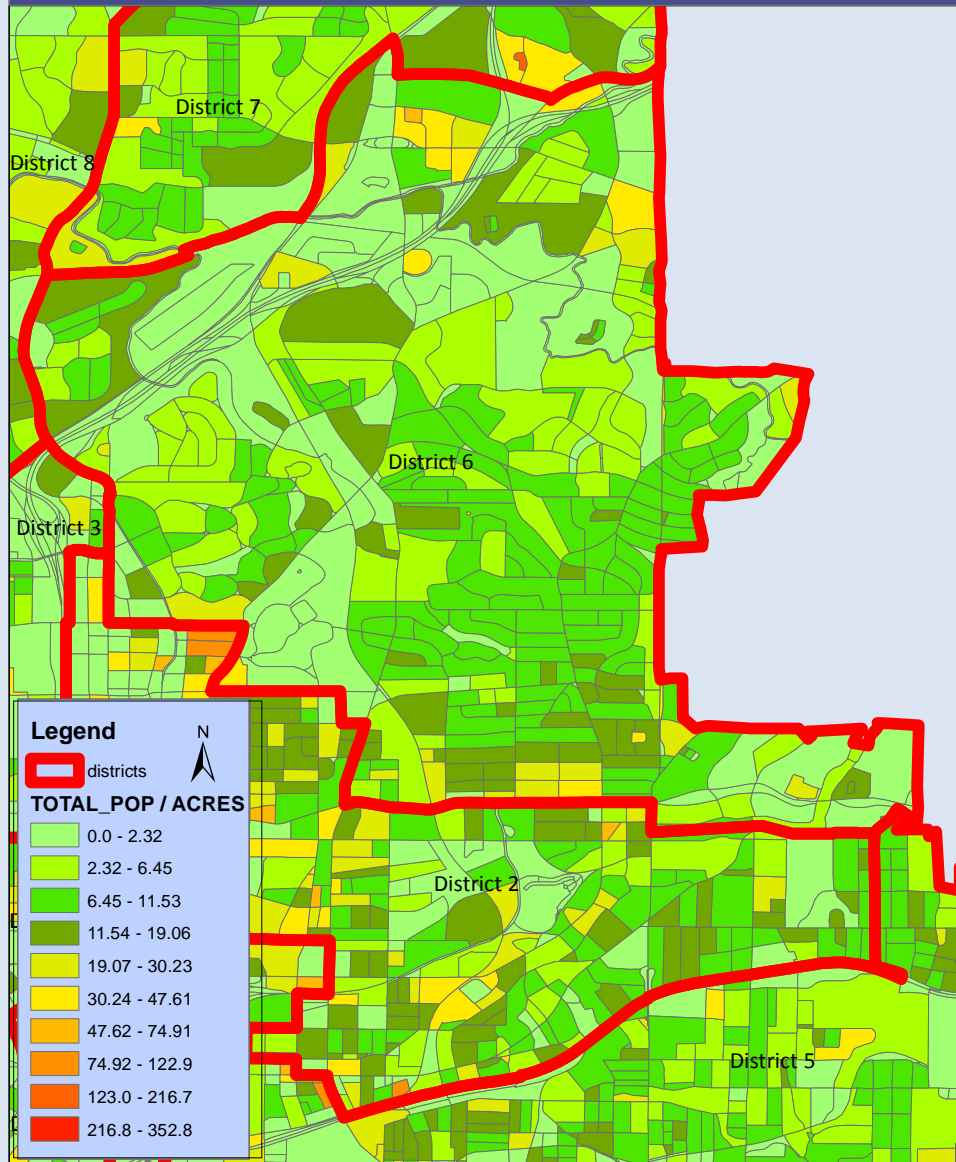




City of Atlanta Council District 6: 2010 Population Density

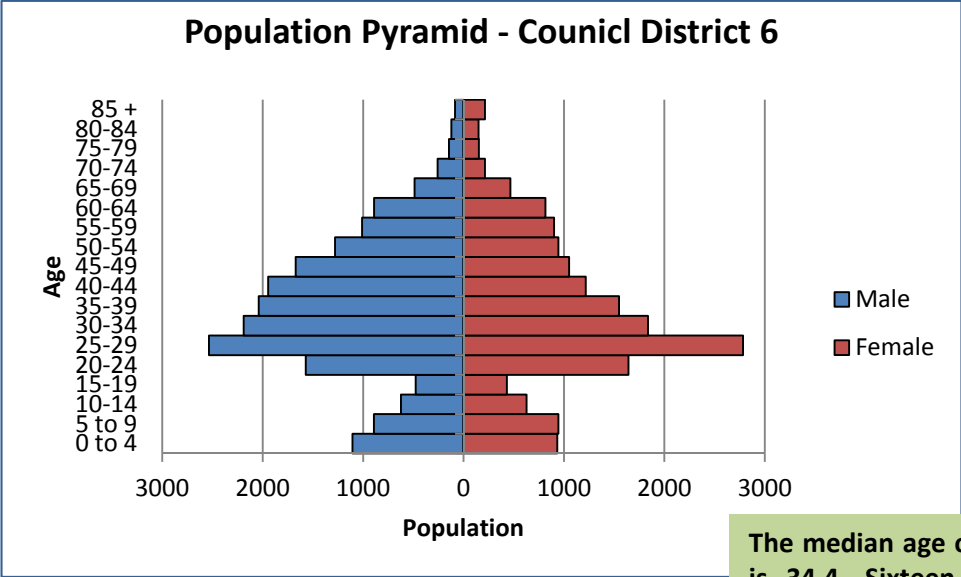


CITY OF ATLANTA – Council District 6 - 2010 POPULATION

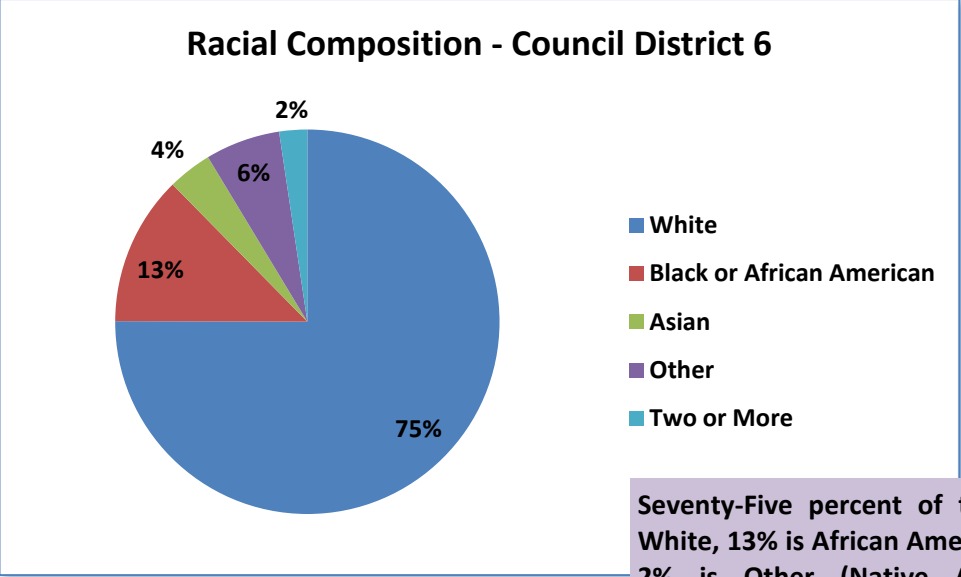
According to the 2010 U.S. Census, the population of the City of Atlanta Council District 6 is 36,203.

The Map shows the population density (persons per acre) of each Census Block in District 6. District 6 has an overall density of 7.2 persons per acre.

City of Atlanta 2010 Census Summary



The median age of the population is 34.4. Sixteen percent of the population is under 18, 6% of the population is over 65 and 45% of the population is between 20 and 39 years old.

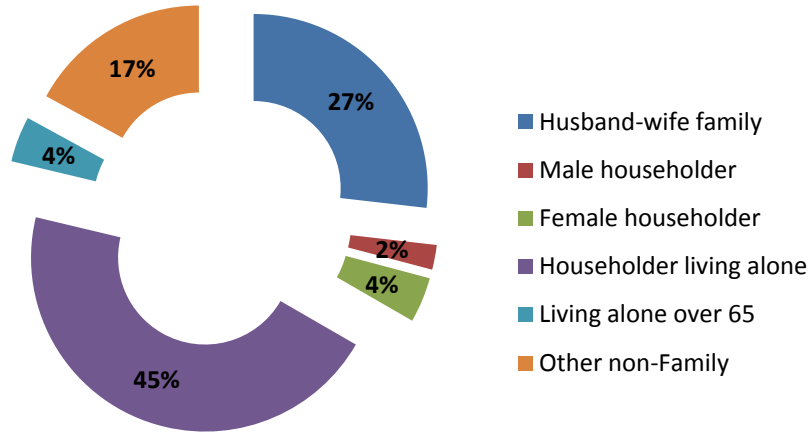


Seventy-Five percent of the population is White, 13% is African American, 4% is Asian, 2% is Other (Native American, Pacific Islander and Other) and 6% are two or more races. Twelve percent of the population is of Hispanic or Latin Origin.



HOUSEHOLDS

Household Composition - Council District 6

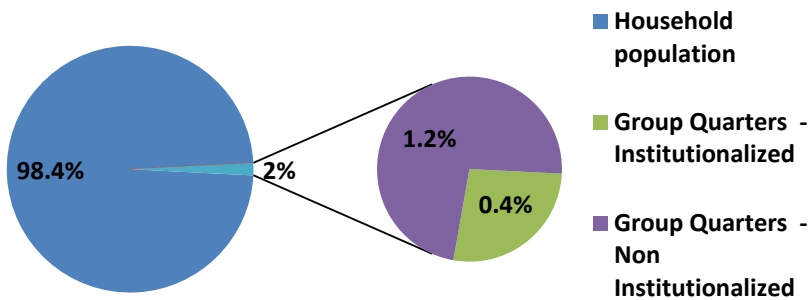


There are 35,625 District 6 residents in 18,839 households. Of these, 33% are family households and 67% are non-family households. Of all households, 17% have children under age 18 and 9% have an individual 65 years and older.

Forty-nine percent of households are single person households, 4% are female headed households and 27% are husband and wife households.

The average household size is 1.9 persons per household and the average family size is 2.9 persons per family.

Household and Group Quarter Population - Council District 6



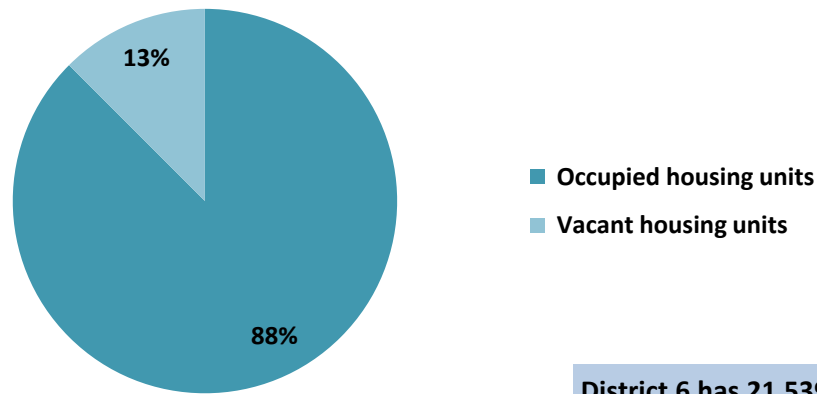
Most of the District 6 population (98%) lives in households while 2% (578) live in Group Quarters.

Most of the Group Quarter population lives in Non-Institutionalized Group Quarters.



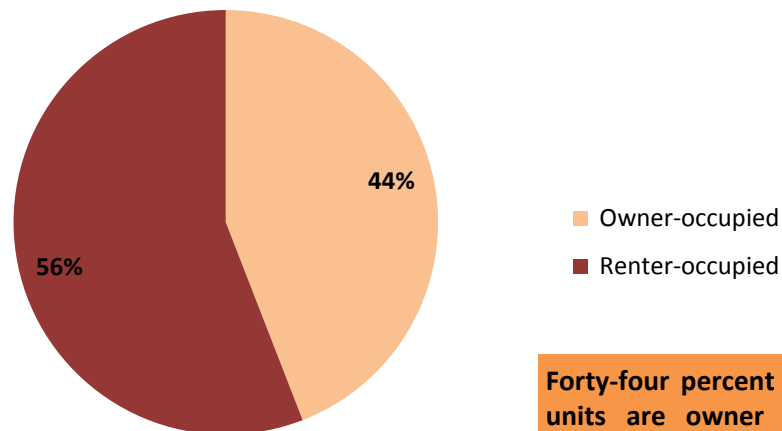
HOUSING

Housing Occupancy - Council District 6



District 6 has 21,539 housing units. Of these, 88% are occupied and 13% are vacant. Rental units have 15% vacancy rate while owner occupied units have a 4% vacancy rate.

Housing Tenure - Council District 6



Forty-four percent of the occupied housing units are owner occupied and 56% are renter occupied. Owner occupied units have a larger household size (2.1) than renter occupied units (1.7).
