


CITY OF ATLANTA – Council District 5 - 2010 POPULATION

According to the 2010 U.S. Census, the population of the City of Atlanta Council District 5 is 33,611.


The Map shows the population density (persons per acre) of each Census Block in District 5. District 5 has an overall density of 7.1 persons per acre.

is 33.3. Fourteen percent of the population is under 18, 9% of the population is over 65 and 43% of the population is between 20 and 39 years old.



HOUSEHOLDS




There are 30,376 District 5 residents in 15,076 households. Of these, 40% are family households and 60% are non-family households. Of all households, 19% have children under age 18 and 16% have an individual 65 years and older.

Forty-three percent of households are single person households, 14% are female headed households and 23% are husband and wife households.

The average household size is 2.0 persons per household and the average family size is 2.9 persons per family.






Most of the District 5 population (90%) lives in households while 10% (3,235) live in Group Quarters.


Most of the Group Quarter population lives in Non-Institutionalized Group Quarters, mainly college and university housing.
