
SPRING AND WEST PEACHTREE STREETS

ABOUT THE PROJECTS

The Spring Street FTA project and Spring and West Peachtree Streets Safer Streets Initiative projects are working to transform these corridors into bicycle- and pedestrian-friendly corridors.


The Spring Street FTA project is funded through a Federal Transit Administration grant. The FTA awarded this grant in order to increase connectivity for all modes along existing corridors to better reach transit facilties.

In September of 2019, the City of Atlanta announced its **Safer Streets Initiative**, a **two-year**, **\$5** million plan to bring accelerated safety redesigns to Atlanta's streets, identifying more than **20** city corridors - including West Peachtree and Spring Streets - for rapid implementation changes to improve safety for people who walk, drive, take transit or ride a bike or e-scooter.

THE ACTION PLAN FOR SAFER STREETS AIMS TO...

- * Provide north-south connections between Midtown and Downtown
- Expand access to MARTA stations, city parks, and schools by providing first/last mile connections
- * Reduce risk as 100% of routes are on the city's high-injury network or near schools

TARGET NETWORK FOR SAFER MULTI-MODAL STREETS








BICYCLE MASTER PLAN

FOR THE MIDTOWN IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT








WEST PEACHTREE STREET AND SPRING STREET


SAFER STREETS INITIATIVE PROJECT

TWO-WAY CYCLE TRACK WITH PARKING






WEST PEACHTREE STREET | TYPICAL SECTION

ONE-WAY CYCLE TRACK WITHOUT PARKING






SPRING STREET | TYPICAL SECTION


