A native Atlantan, Chiquita earned a bachelor's degree in Human Relations at Point University and is pursuing a master's in Clinical Mental Health Counseling. "I love people,

In honor of Black History Month, I would like to remember a colleague and friend who is a part of Black History in the City of Atlanta. Though extremely petite, Sharon Lester had a largerthan-life personality. She was feisty, fearless and an extremely competitive sportswoman. Sharon managed the Piedmont Tennis Center for eleven years of her twenty-year tenure with the Office of Recreation. She loved Piedmont; it was her second home. She was a great support to the tennis community and supervised over 900 adults and 500 youth players monthly. She

was especially proud of Grady High School's girl's tennis team, whom she helped coach. Sharon Lester was always a positive force, constantly encouraging players. She kept tennis fun while playing a fierce game and coaching her opponent through it all. Unfortunately, this beautiful spirit passed away



unexpectedly at the age 44 in 2007. Sharon Lester is the first African American woman to have a Tennis Center named in her honor in the City of Atlanta. We recognize and celebrate Sharon for her service, tenacity and commitment to tennis. Ramondo Davidson
