
What is a Brownfield?

A brownfield is a property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant. CERCLA 101(39)

"Blight"

"Abandoned"

"Derelict"





Brownfields and Land Revitalization Program: We are CERCLA, and....

- Region 4 has 9 Project Officers who manage over 150 Brownfield grants per year:
 - \$78.5 million in competitive grants.
 - About \$5.5 million in State and Tribal Assistance Grants (STAGs); supports FDEP's Brownfield Program.
- Beyond Grant Management, Project Managers are like RPMs and technical – scientists/engineers
 - Perform outreach to potential applicants/partner communities
 - Engage with Communities & provide Customer Service
 - Provide Land Revitalization & Leveraging Assistance
 - Participate in Agency Cross-Program Initiatives
 - Serve as Partners with States and Tribes



EPA Brownfield Assistance

Competitive Grants

- -Assessment Grant (\$200-600K)
- -Cleanup Grant (\$500K+)
- -Revolving Loan Fund Grant (RLF) (\$800K-1M)
- -Multipurpose Grant (\$800-1M)
- -Job Training Grant (\$200K)

Competitive Grants

Other support (not grants)

- -Targeted Brownfields Assessments (TBA) \$3.9M FY22
- Land Revitalization Technical Assist. \$550k in FY22
- Technical Assistance to Brownfields (TAB)



Assessment Grant Program

- Provides funds to carry out brownfield assessment activities at eligible sites including:
 - Site inventory
 - Prioritizing sites
 - Phase I & II assessments (should be %60 of the funds)
 - Supplemental assessments: Pb and asbestos surveys
 - Community outreach & involvement
 - Cleanup planning (Analysis of Brownfield Cleanup Alternatives (ABCA))
 - Site reuse planning
- Liability: none, if they (the grantee) does not own the site

Targeted Brownfields Assistance (TBA)

- Superfund Start Contract
- Limited to field work, phase I', II's, vapor intrusion, Pb/Asbestos, etc.
- No reuse planning
- Nominal community interaction
- Wedge in the door: TBA should lead to a cleanup grant!! And, more options
- Liability: follows CERCLA
 - Ideal sites: innocent landowners, municipal site through tax default
 - Petro sites only if 2 owner/operators away from last owner/operator
 - Liability of requester is question, not property owner
 - Reuse plans for requester expected.

Technical Assistance

- OBLR holds the "grants"; each has a focus
- Regions request projects be done \$30-50K
- Can also be done with assessment & cleanup grants; but skips the site work
- MUST be tied to a Brownfield site with grant/TBA work on-going/planned
- Can't do site sampling

Technical Assistance to Brownfields (TAB)

- Each Region has \$1.5M for 5 years
- ANY community can call and ask for assistance (wild card)
- October 1, 2021 starts new 5 year cycle with International City/County Management Association (ICMA) – new to TAB, but BF program has evolved
- Regional Goal for TBA: peer-to-peer and building networks
- EPA does not control the grantee (ICMA)
- We guide prioritization
- Can't do any site sampling
- General education/capacity building AND Next Steps on Community level
- Broadest tool available
- Can't do everything for everyone; culling will be done

- 1. Come in around an existing CD/permit or existing program jurisdiction
- 2. Come in around an existing State Brownfields agreement
