- 1. **Minutes.** No Business Meeting was held in February.
- 2. **Arborist Division Staffing.** Arborist Plan Reviewer position for 5th plan reviewer remains open. Greg Ihle, Field Arborist, has left City employment. Opening for Field Arborist.
- 3. **Urban Forestry Grant.** Revision work continues. Nearing completion. Hope to finalize grant agreement by summer.
- 4. **Appeal Hearing**. Schedule. Only hearing for March (March 20). Attending: Nabil, Lawrence, Peyton, Susan, Julia (tentative).
- 5. **Quarterly Reports**. Reporting is being updated. Will make information much more accessible and timely. Will include and interactive dashboard.
- 6. Tree Ordinance update.
 - Stakeholder interview with Facilitator, Michael Elliott, was held Friday, January 16 (Nabil Hammam, Kathy Evans, and Taryn Heidel. We presented TCC's primary concerns including:
 - need for greater tree protection to curb losses;
 - adjust recompense (which has not been updated since 2003);
 - re-evaluate "max" recompense formula as well as "standard" recompense; and 3) enforcement.
 - Phase 2, Tree Ordinance Update meetings are scheduled every other week (Thursday mornings, 2 hours) through May.
 - Initial meeting (1/19/24). Set ground rules. Group members should commit to attendance (and designate an alternate who is kept abreast of issues). Heard a presentation on Canopy analyses.
 - Second meeting (2/2/24). Heard a presentation on Heat Vulnerability in Atlanta.
 Facilitator presented a list of issues identified stakeholder interviews (Sept-Jan):
 - What trees should we protect/enhance?
 - What trees can be removed?
 - What constitutes appropriate replacement of approved trees?
 - Who pays? How much?
 - How do we equitably distribute the costs and benefits of trees and tree preservation?
 - How do we facilitate development while protecting trees?
 - How do we improve tree canopy in a rapidly developing city?
 - o *Third meeting.* Scheduled for 3/21/24.
 - Discussed importance of tree canopy for cooling and reducing heat vulnerability, morbidity, and mortality.
