NPU-R VOTING RULES per 2024 NPU-R Bylaws

Eligible members shall be any person 18 years of age or older whose primary place of residence is within the NPU-R designated area or a representative of any corporation, organization, institution, or agency which owns property or has a place of business or profession within NPU-R designated area (Article II, Sec. 2.1-2). All persons eligible for membership (as defined in Article II) shall have one vote on all general body issues. To become eligible to vote in elections, Bylaws adoption and/or revisions, members are required to have attended a minimum of four (4) general body meetings within the calendar year in which the election takes place (Article II, Sec. 2.2).

Sec. 6-3019 Prohibition of Political Forums

"Neighborhood planning unit meetings shall not be used for political forums or campaigning for city, county, state, or federal elections."

- Distributing campaign materials and literature; and
- Conducting either of the above in City Hall, its rooms or offices.
